# A Message from Fr. Andrew

"I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness."

The Church provides us with several options for the readings this Sunday. One of the first readings is from Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7, and the words I quoted above are words taken from the first option for the first reading. If I had asked, who do you think the words above are pointing to? The answer seems obvious: JESUS! Jesus is the one who brought the victory of justice, the one who instituted the new covenant, the true light of the nations, and the one who saved us from our slavery. Furthermore, humanity regained the hope for eternal life as the gate of heaven opened through Him.

However, I want to ask you another question: Is this verse just about Jesus? I will boldly say NO. This should make us think: this verse is about all of us! When we were baptized, along with the dignity of being sons and daughters of God, we were given the three missions of Christ Himself. Just like Christ fully lived out His mission as the Prophet, the Priest, and the King, we are supposed to live these three missions out. The gift of baptism doesn't just bestow grace upon us, it empowers us. It elevates us to become so much more than passive recipients of grace. We are joined to the mission of Christ our Lord, as His hands and feet; we become the dwelling places of the Holy Spirit!

Today, we celebrate the baptism of the Lord. On this beautiful feast day, we remember and celebrate three elements of Christ's baptism. That Christ, although He did not need to be baptized due to His sinlessness, sanctifies the water of baptism by receiving baptism. This timeless act of humility allows all of us (who are joined to the baptism of Christ) to receive the gift of new life through the waters of baptism He sanctified. Also, by immersing Himself in the water of the Jordan, which at the time was filled with the filth of human sinfulness as it washed away people's sinfulness, He completely identifies with sinners. Christ does this – he identifies himself with sinners - not to be part of sin but to bring our sinfulness to the cross and destroy our slavery to it by offering Himself on the cross.

These things we remember on this feast should make us appreciate Christ sharing His mission. Of course, we are imperfect. Of course, we are inadequate. Yet, we must remember our responsibility to let God use us as His instrument. We must not let Christ's desire to share His mission with us go to waste. It is not about how great we are, but all about how great He is for drawing straight lines with crooked hands. Today's feast holds us accountable to this Christian responsibility.

What are the ways we can let Christ work through us this week? How can we exercise the three missions of Christ? In ways small and big, may all of us become instruments who bring God's justice, light, and freedom this week. For instance, as priests, we can pray for those in need; as prophets, we can share the Good news with others; and as kings, we can serve our community with humility and love.
