January 19th, 2025 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Brian

The story is told of the little boy who was listening to a long and excessively boring homily in church (you never get those at OLS, right?!). Suddenly the red sanctuary lamp near the tabernacle caught his eye. Tugging his father's sleeve, he said, "Daddy, when the light turns green can we go home?"

The sanctuary lamp in our church is still red (which means that Jesus is in the tabernacle), but the altar cloth has been changed to green, and the priests and deacons are now wearing green vestments. After spending Advent preparing ourselves for the birth of the Messiah, and after celebrating that birth at Christmas and in the days and weeks following, liturgically speaking, we are now in Ordinary Time.

This season of Ordinary Time will continue until Ash Wednesday, which falls on March 5th. This is a very late date and that's because Easter is late this year, falling on April 20th. After the liturgical seasons of Lent and Easter, we will re-commence Ordinary Time on June 9th and continue until next Advent, which begins on November 30th.

Of course, we should never think of time as "ordinary." Time is sacred because it too was created by God. We use the term "Ordinary Time" to refer to the fact that the life of the Church is ordered during those weeks when we live our lives neither in penance (Advent and Lent) nor in feasting (the Christmas and Easter seasons). During these days of "Ordinary Time," we focus on the fact that Jesus walks among us in the ordinariness of our lives and that we should allow Him to transform our lives.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear about the first recorded miracle of Jesus: turning water into wine (I wish I had that power!). Jesus would spend the next 3 years performing many other miracles. But remember, the first 30 years of Jesus' life were spent in preparation for those 3 busy years of public activity of preaching, teaching, healing, and performing miracles. It was the ordinary days of His first 30 years – many of which I'm sure were spent in the company of His mother Mary – that Jesus prepared Himself for the mission that the Father had given Him. During those 30 "silent" years, Jesus lived out His daily life in rather ordinary ways. While those days may have been ordinary, Jesus lived them prayerfully, and with extraordinary love, which He showed to His mother, to His other relatives, and to His neighbors and complete strangers. In other words, Jesus made sure to sanctify them, through a life of prayer and acts of love.

That's the formula for us! We sanctify our "ordinary" time by means of prayer and acts of love. During this "Ordinary" time, we should remember that each of us, as a disciple of Christ, is called to live an extraordinary life of prayer and acts of love.

Do you know what's ordinary? A life of sin, a life of giving in to the current trend, of surrendering to our desires, of living only for ourselves. An extraordinary life, on the other hand, is one which takes account of God's daily presence in our lives, which talks to God every day in prayer, and which seeks to always love our neighbor.

It's not too late to make one more New Year's resolution for 2025: to pray more and to love more. If we do that, we'll have sanctified our days, and this year will have been truly extraordinary.
