A Message from Fr. Andrew

I have always had an interest in the United States military, especially fighter jets and all manner of advanced weapons. My interest in the military extends to different units as well. One of the world's most impressive is the U.S. Navy special forces – i.e. the Navy SEAL. "The only easy day was yesterday" and "Uncompromising integrity is my standard" are some of their most famous quotes. Both accurately represent the values and strength of the unit. They'll never give up giving their best efforts in every mission so that you and I can live in peace and freedom.

Today's Gospel continues the Gospel we heard last Sunday about Christ's teachings of the Beatitudes. Last week, Christ taught us about true blessedness. He says those truly blessed are those who are poor (whose only wealth is God) and those who hunger for righteousness despite the persecutions. Today, He teaches us how to live out the Beatitudes. And though this might sound counter-intuitive, so are the ways He teaches us to do so.

If the two quotes I shared above are two famous quotes representing who the SEALS are, today's Gospel is filled with quotes representing who we are called to be as Christians: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you."; "Pray for those who mistreat you."; and "To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well." How do these teachings of Christ make us feel? If our initial reaction was something like, is Christ teaching us to become fools? The answer is yes.

Christ is telling us to embrace our call to become fools in the eyes of the world. What seems to be foolish in the eyes of the world is often seen as wise in God's eyes. Isn't that what the paradox of the crucifixion of our Lord teaches us? If we, just like those who do not believe in God, are kind and charitable only to those who treat us well, what distinguishes us as disciples?

The Navy SEALS' spirit as distinguished warriors derives from their willingness to embrace dangers and sufferings on behalf of our nation and their fellow troops sharing the foxhole. We are Christ's soldiers. Of course, we do not fight through force or advanced weapons. We are called to fight the darkness of an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth with a Christlike heart of forgiveness, generosity, and charity.

Do we want to be highly distinguished soldiers of Christ? Then, let's learn something from the SEALS. Let's think about what uncompromised integrity for Christians looks like. Two of the most significant examples would be being merciful to others just as our heavenly Father is merciful and loving one another as Christ has loved us. It's not easy. That's why we must stay near to the Lord, who alone provides us with the grace to walk the path of discipleship. But if we are faithful in our mission, we will meet the Lord who is waiting - as He says in today's Gospel – to reward us with gifts that are overflowing.
