#### A Message from Fr. Andrew

St. Francis was a humble and loving saint. Countless stories attest to how great an instrument he was spreading the Good News of Christ across Western Europe during the time of the Church's struggle with wealth and power. What makes him the true hero in the history of the Roman Catholic Church is His radical imitation of Christ in his efforts to reform the Church through the love of poverty.

Early Franciscans followed the footsteps of St. Francis and joined him in practicing 40 days of fasting during both the seasons of Lent and Advent. St. Francis ate only a half-loaf of bread for the WHOLE 40 DAYS! He consumed even that tiny amount of food, not because he couldn't endure hunger, but to fight the temptation of vainglory. Although trying his best, one of Francis's early followers could not endure the lengthy fasting that St. Francis practiced. As Francis saw the young friar's struggle, he commanded his other followers to set the table for a meal together. He began eating and invited the rest to join him. The early disciples of Francis were astonished, for they were expecting the young friar to be rebuked. By breaking the fast, Francis taught his disciples that fraternal charity is more important than the practice of penance. Instead of shaming the man, Francis broke his own fast, broke his bread to share, and invited the rest to this duty of charity so that the hungry brother could eat without being ashamed of himself.

We celebrate the first Sunday of Lent, and perhaps some of us still haven't decided what to give up. Regardless of the things we choose to do during this Lent, we must remember the lesson St. Francis teaches in this story: The purpose of penance and fasting is to grow in us a stronger love for Christ and our neighbors. Fasting just for the sake of fasting can be dangerous. Focusing too much on our "doings" will make these 40 days not Lent but rather a 40-day challenge, boosting our ego. It is essential to ask ourselves. Why do we fast and give up what we like during Lent? It is to imitate the life of Christ, which was filled with suffering to save us. It is to prepare ourselves for the joy of Easter, and it is also to bring ourselves to focus on our hope for heaven by restricting our bodily comfort and satisfaction. All our Lenten disciplines should orient us to true inner conversion and freedom from unnecessary attachments. These practices will lead us to charity. If our focus isn't charity in doing what we do during Lent, we must sit and reevaluate if our priorities are set correctly. We don't fast to punish our bodies but fast to grow in Christ-like charity. Let's learn from St. Francis, who always put the imitation of Christ at the center of all spiritual disciplines.

During this season of Lent, our parish community will have the privilege of having the 21st-century disciples of St. Francis – The Community of Franciscan Friars of the Renewal - at our three-day parish mission. Carrying out the missions and charism of St. Francis, CFR brothers and priests will lead us closer to Christ by renewing our hope in the Lord. This three-day parish retreat from Monday, March 24<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday, March 27<sup>th</sup>, from 7 pm to 9 pm, will include confessions and Eucharistic Healing! Please join us, and may our Lent be the time to join the footsteps of Jesus in the desert in prayers, fasting, and almsgiving.

# South Orange & Maplewood Interfaith Holocaust Remembrance Service March 23, 2025

Join us for the 48th Annual SOMA Interfaith Holocaust Remembrance Service on Sunday, March 23, 2025, at Congregation Beth El, South Orange.

Our event begins at 3:00 PM with the March of Remembrance and Hope from Spiotta Park, honoring the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust, along with millions of others who were brutally murdered by the Nazi regime. The service follows at 4:00 PM, exploring the theme of Resistance and Resilience with guest speaker Dr. Jud Newborn, an Emmy Award-winning historian and co-author of Sophie Scholl and the White Rose.

This year, Stephen Schwartz and Sylvia Ben-Asher, a Warsaw Ghetto survivor, will receive the Sister Rose Thering Holocaust Education Award for their impactful work in Holocaust education.

Our interfaith event is a powerful stand against resurgent anti-semitism and hate. We invite the SOMA community to come together in remembrance — to honor the past, tell its story, and build a brighter future of tolerance and understanding.

The Rosary Society's next meeting will be Wednesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in St. Joseph Hall. All are welcome to attend!


