#### A Message from Stephanie Sonnick

Friends,

Do you believe in the depths of your heart that God is powerful?

It might seem like a silly question to pose to you. After all, here you are reading the Sunday bulletin – a sign that you're most likely a parishioner of ours, perhaps for many years, and you've joined us week after week here on Sunday to worship the Lord. "Of course I believe that God is powerful," you might be saying to yourself. "Why would you ask that, Stephanie?" Well, you're in luck: I'll use the rest of this short article to tell you why I'm asking this question and to share something exciting with you. Here goes nothing...

First, we see God's power on display in this Sunday's readings. Our first reading from the Book of Genesis describes the promise that God makes to Abram: "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur [a foreign land] to give you this land [Canaan, the Promised Land] as a possession." That's a big promise to make to one, lonely Abram in an ancient world full of ruthless empires, violence, slavery and death. And yet God promises and ratifies His promise in the ceremony at the end of the first reading. This ceremony, involving the spilling of animal blood, binds both parties to the promise in a solemn, permanent binding agreement called a covenant. And then what happens? After a long journey for the Israelites: His promise is fulfilled. Today's Gospel serves as a parallel and fulfillment of that first scene from Genesis. In Luke, we hear of the Transfiguration, where God reveals His glory to Peter, James and John. They are wrapped up into His glory in a "cloud," and they hear the voice of the Father proclaim, "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him." They are stunned into silence – an unusual reaction from these three – and an indicator of the profundity of what they've experienced.

In both of these scenes, God's power is not merely on display like biceps at the gym: rather, He uses His power to show His fidelity to humanity! This is true even today: God's power is at work just as it was to bring the Israelites to the Promised Land, and just as it was in Jesus' sacrificing His life for our liberation from sin through life in His Spirit. If you're anything like me, you want to see God's power work in your life. Not "out there," but "in here" – in your heart, and your home, and your relationships.

God wants to show You His loving power and how it can change your life – I'm sure of it. So, this Lent, we invite you to come and encounter God's transformative, loving power at our **OLS Parish Mission**, happening March 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup> from 7-9pm in the Upper Church. Come all 3 evenings, but come one or two evenings if that's all your schedule permits. There's no need to register, but if you do register you will be entered to win a free copy of the Friars' popular spiritual book *Habits for Holiness*.

A Parish Mission is like an **in-house retreat** and will feature three evenings of inspiring talks and prayer by a religious community of spiritual masters, the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. Our staff is so excited to offer you this opportunity during Lent and during this Jubilee Year of Hope, and we invite you to join us for each of the three evenings!! I myself have benefitted incredibly from the ministry of the Friars of the Renewal, and I'm so excited that you will have the opportunity to experience them as channels of God's powerful,

personal love for you in just under two weeks. Below is a more detailed outline of what to expect on each of these three evenings as the Friars walk us through our mission, which will include the Sacrament of Confession on the evening of Tuesday, March 25<sup>th</sup>. Confession on this evening will serve as our annual Lenten Penance Service. Please join us and bring your friends and family to receive what God and His power have in store for you!



Join us for the 48th Annual SOMA Interfaith Holocaust Remembrance Service on Sunday, March 23, 2025, at Congregation Beth El, South Orange.

Our event begins at 3:00 PM with the March of Remembrance and Hope from Spiotta Park, honoring the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust, along with millions of others who were brutally murdered by the Nazi regime. The service follows at 4:00 PM, exploring the theme of Resistance and Resilience with guest speaker Dr. Jud Newborn, an Emmy Award-winning historian and co-author of Sophie Scholl and the White Rose.

This year, Stephen Schwartz and Sylvia Ben-Asher, a Warsaw Ghetto survivor, will receive the Sister Rose Thering Holocaust Education Award for their impactful work in Holocaust education.

Our interfaith event is a powerful stand against resurgent anti-semitism and hate. We invite the SOMA community to come together in remembrance — to honor the past, tell its story, and build a brighter future of tolerance and understanding.
