

On behalf of the priests, deacons, religious sisters, and the entire staff of Our Lady of Sorrows, I'm so very happy to say, "Happy Easter!" On this glorious day, we gather together and rejoice in the greatest truth of our Christian faith: the possibility of new life that has been given to us in virtue of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Divine Savior.

We celebrate the fact that the tomb is now empty. The pyramids of Egypt are famous because they contain the mummified bodies of ancient Egyptian kings. Westminster Abbey in London is famous, in part, because in it rests the bodies of English nobles and notables. Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia is famous, because it is the honored resting place of so many outstanding American heroes. But the Garden Tomb of Jesus is famous because...it is empty!



Fun Facts About Easter

"Easter is the most important liturgical time for Catholics. It celebrates Jesus's victory of sin and death and salvation for mankind. It is God's greatest act of love to redeem mankind." – USCCB

It's important to remember that Easter isn't over at 11:59pm on Sunday: it's a season that lasts for 50 days! Here are a few interesting things to know about Easter sourced from ChurchPOP (www.churchpop.com):

- 1. The liturgical season of Easter is the second-longest season on the Church calendar. The longest is Ordinary Time.
- 2. The word 'Easter' comes from Old English, meaning simply the 'East.' The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world.
- 3. The feast of Christ's Ascension into Heaven falls on the 40th day of Easter.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (<u>665-667</u>): "Christ's ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain, whence he will come again (cf. Acts 1:11)..."

4. We celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday on the second Sunday of Easter. Jesus expressed His desire for a feast celebrating his mercy and told Sr. Faustina that it was to be the Sunday after Easter.

5. The period of Easter Sunday until Divine Mercy Sunday is called the Octave of Easter. This is the first phase of the Easter season and an extension of the Easter celebration. Eastertide is considered the period of time after the octave of Easter.
