

2nd Sunday of Easter – Divine Mercy Sunday

A Message from Fr. Brian

Happy Easter! The Octave of Easter ends on the Sunday after Easter and so each of the 8 days in that Octave is celebrated as a "little Easter." This 2nd Sunday of Easter is also called Divine Mercy Sunday, and this Feast of Divine Mercy was instituted in the universal Church by Pope St. John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska on April 30, 2000 (I was personally present at that canonization!). St. Faustina was born in Poland in 1905, the 3rd of 10 children. At the age of 19, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. In the 1930s, St. Faustina received many revelations from Our Lord. Foremost among those revelations, Jesus asked her to help spread the message of God's plan of mercy for the world. She became an "apostle" of God's mercy, a "secretary" of the message of God's mercy.

So often we spend too much time focusing on our failings – and not enough on God's mercy. This Sunday, Jesus wants to give us the right perspective. On this Feast of Divine Mercy, we really should strive to take to heart, to trust in, and to believe the beautiful words that we hear in today's responsorial psalm: "His mercy endures forever."

This Feast is also an invitation to entrust ourselves more fully to God's providence. The image depicting Divine Mercy has at the bottom of it the words, "Jesus, I trust in you." It's easy for us to trust in God when our health is good, when our job situation is bright, when everyone in our family seems

to be sailing along smoothly. But it's not always so easy to trust or believe in God when our life seems to be in chaos, when our health is failing, when our economic situation is not great, when we have family problems, or when death strikes close to home. At those times our faith is challenged and perhaps doubts crop up in our minds about God's love for us or even about His very existence. Don't worry: we're not alone. In this Sunday's Gospel, St. Thomas also struggled to believe even when Jesus was standing right in front of him!



Growing in holiness doesn't mean we live in a continual mystical union with God; it doesn't mean that we don't feel abandoned at times; it doesn't mean that we aren't occasionally pestered by doubts. But growing in holiness does mean that at those moments when we clearly feel God's absence, we nevertheless entrust ourselves to Him, we abandon ourselves to Him and we say "Jesus, I trust in you."

That's not to suggest that we'll experience an emotional high by just saying those words, but it does mean that when we unite ourselves to Jesus in this way, we make an incredible act of faith, a heroic act of faith, one worthy of the great saints.

In short, we defeat doubt by imitating St. Thomas when he said, "My Lord and my God." We defeat despair and darkness by saying the words, "Jesus, I trust in You."

We defeat feelings of being by abandoned by God by remembering what Jesus said through St. Faustina: "A humble soul does not trust itself, but places all its confidence in God."
