#### A Message from Fr. Brian

This Sunday's Psalm response is, *"O God, let all the nations praise you!"* When Pope Leo XIV was elected, it seemed as though the near universal response throughout the world was one of great jubilation, as we praised God for calling Pope Leo (an American!) to be the next successor of St. Peter.

Pope Leo has ignited a wave of goodwill and hope throughout the Church and indeed the world, as we see in him a man of humility, goodness, kindness, holiness, great intellect, administrative skill, and so many other wonderful human qualities. It is my own hope that Pope Leo will, more than anything else, bring unity to our fractured and divided world and Church. I suspect that he is uniquely qualified to bring us closer to the realization of the dream that Jesus had, when He prayed at the Last Supper, *"that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me."* (John 17:21)

One of the things that would help to unite us as a Church would be for each of us to see ourselves as indispensable members of the Church who understand that union and communion within the Church is Jesus' desire for us and that such union is a hallmark of our being members of the Church. Pope Leo was (is) a member of the Augustinian religious order. Not long before his election, the former Cardinal Prevost (who chose – much to my delight! – the name Leo) was asked, "How does the figure of St. Augustine help you in your daily life?"

The future Pope responded in this way: "When I think of St. Augustine, his vision and understanding of what it means to belong to the Church, one of the first things that springs to mind is what he says about how you cannot say you are a follower of Christ without being part of the Church. Christ is part of the Church. He is the head. So people who think they can follow Christ 'in their own way' without being part of the body, are, unfortunately, living a distortion of what is really an authentic experience. St. Augustine's teachings touch every part of life and help us to live in communion. Unity and communion are essential charisms of the life of the Order and a fundamental part of understanding what the Church is and what it means to be in it."

One of the components of being a part of the Church therefore is to see ourselves as united to one another, especially in the virtues of faith, hope, and charity. Though it is (by far!) my least favorite part of being a pastor, I must once again call upon one of those virtues in particular: your charity, your goodness, your generosity. As you know by now, the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal is well underway and our participation in this Appeal is in many ways a demonstration of our knowledge that to be a part of the Church means to support not just our local parish, but the Church's wider mission as well, especially in the local church of the Archdiocese of Newark.

The Annual Appeal funds essential programs and ministries at the heart of our Catholic mission. It supports the efforts of the Archdiocese in proclaiming the Gospel, of passing on the faith to future generations, and of caring for the poor and those on the margins. Without the Annual Appeal, our mission as a Church would be hindered to a degree that none of us would wish to contemplate.

To those who have made a gift to this year's Annual Appeal, thank you! While we have made our parish goal for four years in a row (after many years of not making our goal) we are FAR, FAR behind in making our goal this year, which is \$85,107. If (when!) we make our goal, we will receive a 2% reduction in the rate of assessments we owe to the Archdiocese. 2% may not seem like a lot, but by making our goal it actually saves the parish about \$18,000, which is an enormous help to us. But we need to make our goal (in funds collected, not just pledged) by June 30<sup>th</sup>.

Your gift, if made and received by June 30<sup>th</sup>, will aid both the Archdiocese of Newark and our beloved parish of OLS. Please take to heart the words of Pope Leo, seeing yourselves as an important part of the Church, which carries with it both great blessings as well as great responsibilities. Once again, thank you for your generosity to the Appeal and to our wonderful parish!
