#### A Message from Fr. Andrew

Through the Resurrection, Christ revealed to us that not only are we to share the same nature with our God, who is now both God and Man, but also the glory of His Resurrection. What a great wonder of love! God not only saves but also glorifies us. In God's unity with humanity in Jesus Christ, His Good Friday became the complete ransom for our sins, a moment of profound relief. His Easter Sunday became the seal of our resurrection, and His Ascension became the source of our glory and the final blow against the netherworld that had so wished our destruction.

But let's reflect on what has brought us to this day of great joy - our journey. It took us the forty days of Lent, the forty days of Easter. However, long before that, it took the forty days and nights of rain during the time of the great flood in Genesis, forty days and nights of Moses on Mt. Sinai, forty years of the chosen people's arduous journey through the desert, and forty days of Jesus in the desert praying and fasting. All those forty days lead to today's celebration, the Ascension, because the events in the Old Testament point to the fulfillments to come in the New Testament. Why forty? The number forty in Sacred Scripture is linked to the concept of a complete period that leads to the transition to a new time. It also denotes the period of trial and testing or waiting for the transition into a better future.

What does this tell us? Today shouldn't just be a day of celebration, but a day of reflection. The fact that this glorious day is linked with the number forty should further lead us to conclude that our glory, our spiritual fulfillment and joy in God, comes after the perseverance of trials and testing times that lead us to completion. What are the forty days and forty nights, or perhaps, forty years we are in? Yes, times of trials are difficult, but, just as God brought us to glorification through the darkness of Good Friday, what if the darkest hours we are in are the means through which God is willing to glorify you and me?

The disciples were still in trial when Christ rose from the dead. They thought they had given up everything to follow the one who claimed to be the Messiah, only to be disappointed. They doubted and were scattered. Yet, Christ was with them all along. He was with them in Emmaus to break the bread, in Galilee to share a breakfast, and in Jerusalem to move the rock that shut Thomas' heart, a tomb before he finally believed in Christ's resurrection.

Friends, our lives aren't too different from those of the early disciples. We doubt, we forget, we wander and feel lost. However, let's remember that we should find joy in our lostness. In it, our Lord will hint to us our glory, reminding us that His coming, dying, and rising weren't just for the first-century Christians, but for all of us, the Christians of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. May this day grant us hope and consolation in our time of desolation in the desert, and become the seal of our Lord's promise, just like it did for the first disciples, who felt lost even after the Resurrection, leading up to the Ascension.

#### Weekly Appeal for the Annual Appeal

In Fr. Brian's bulletin column last week, he thanked those who have already contributed to this year's Annual Appeal and stated our need for greater participation to meet our goal of \$85,107.

Unfortunately, we are **VERY** far behind especially in comparison to where we were at this time last year. Simply put, we really need your help. As you know, if we make our goal (in funds collected, NOT pledged), we receive a 2% reduction in the rate of assessments we owe the Archdiocese. 2% might sound small, but I assure you it would be a significant loss for us – about \$18,000. The Annual Appeal deadline is June 30<sup>th</sup>, which means that as of today, we have only 30 days. My friends, in the words of 80s Swedish rock band Europe, *It's the final countdown*. Time is of the essence!

We'll let you in on a little parish office secret: we often jokingly refer to ourselves as "Our Lady of The Last Second" because sometimes it feels like it's nothing and then everything all at once at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour. Ultimately though, it does get done through, no doubt, the intercession of Our Lady regardless of her title.

We realize that this ask is coming on the heels of our Capital Campaign and appreciate the unique financial position it puts you in with regard to responding to our request. In years prior, the Archdiocese exempted from the Annual Appeal those parishes that had just completed a capital campaign. Unfortunately for all of us, that is no longer the case.

Therefore, we implore you (perhaps not so humbly), to make a donation of ANY amount that is feasible for you. There is no minimum amount for which we are grateful. We ask "Our Lady of The Last Second" to intercede on our behalf and inspire in you a generous heart and desire to help.
