

A Message from Fr. Andrew

The decades of experience of well-known American journalist Sebastian Junger taught him what war truly is. He presented a TED talk on the topic with a seemingly controversial title: Why veterans miss war. Yes, you read it correctly. Why do veterans MISS war? The initial reaction of the crowd reading the title might be - this American journalist is an apathetic maniac who likes to portray our service members as lovers of violence. However, when you listen to him talk, I am sure you will nod towards the end.

He isn't saying that war is a pleasing experience. Nor is he saying that soldiers love life without running water, spare clothing, internet, cooked food, or entertainment. Nor do they miss combat: having to dodge bullets and see their friends fall, or themselves almost being killed and having to live in threat of enemy snipers in Korengal Valley, Afghanistan. They miss the genuine camaraderie of trust, a true sense of brotherhood, knowing that the brothers next to them will carry them away from enemy fire when they are down. What they miss is the lifegiving and sacrificial friendship shared in foxholes they do not see in the lonely society of their homes. This shared experience unites them; it is what they long for in the civilian world.

Junger says that many of them face harsher realities when returning home to the US. They are returning to better living conditions. Yet, unlike in war zones with their brothers, their psychological wounds are met with apathy - not knowing who they can count on, who loves them, and feeling alienated from not knowing if they can find somewhere they could belong. Trying to talk to people to get help but no one around you knowing what you are talking about because they weren't there with you can be scary. Junger states that psychologically speaking, for some veterans, a war zone filled with brotherhood might be easier than being home without any.

Having someone near us who really gets what we are going through is such a great gift. Whether that be our siblings, relatives, or friends, we all want that kind of companionship. Today's second reading assures us that we do. We have Christ. Jesus Christ is not our Lord far away from us, but he is our high priest who can sympathize with our weakness because He was tested in every way like us. His understanding and empathy are unwavering, and He is always there to comfort and support us in our struggles.

We often say to one another, "Don't judge others unless you have walked in their shoes." In that regard, Christ alone is the one who can judge because He has put his two feet in every one of our shoes. Because of this, He alone is the one who fully gets us. Brother Juan Francisco, on Tuesday, in his beautiful reflection, shared with us that Christ shares our same desires: To be seen, known, and loved. How is that possible? Not just because He is all knowing God, but because He shares our humanity.

Each one of us is fighting a battle one way or another. In those endless battles only known to ourselves and God, we must understand we never fight alone. His name is Jesus Immanuel, God who saves, and God who is with us. So, why not stay near Him? We must remember to stay near Him, for He isn't going anywhere.
