#### A Message from Fr. Andrew

On Friday, we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints. Not one, or some, but ALL saints of God. Some of us might think saints are people recognized and canonized by the Church for their holy and heroic lives, which prompted many conversions of others and led them closer to Christ. However, in our Catholic understanding, saints also include those who are in heaven but never got the recognition. In that, on the glorious Solemnity of All Saints, we joyfully celebrate the great work of God expressed in and through all men and women in heaven, in their lives on earth. Although we honor everyone in heaven on this beautiful day, the focus is primarily on those who are canonized. We remember the heroes of our history whose lives teach us timeless lessons, inspiring us to greater ownership and citizenship for our nation. Likewise, commemorating the lives of canonized saints teaches us priceless lessons and values. Their lives instill in our hearts that a Christ-like life is not theoretical or an imagined fairytale, but rather a reality that can be lived out by all of us today.

So, who were saints? They were sinners who kept walking in God and with God. They are the ones who believed in God's greatness more than their own, and they were the ones who walked by faith, not by sight. Some gave witness through their blood, some preached the Gospel in every corner of the earth, some led the flock entrusted to them during the most challenging times, and some served God by serving the poor while living a life of poverty. Some became saints by committing themselves to the most minor task but with great charity. Some were ordained and made their vows, but some were lay people. Perhaps what makes them so great isn't all the great works they accomplished with God's help, their continual conversion, awareness of their nothingness, desire to decrease so God may increase, and desire to share with others what they received from God: the hope for eternal life in heaven.

Who is my favorite saint? I have a few, but the one I like most is St. Dismas, the repentant thief crucified next to Christ. Some may ask how if he was a terrible criminal who was sentenced to die on the cross, how can he be a saint? I will say two things. First, Christ Himself said, "You will be in paradise with me" (although paradise could also be interpreted as the place where the righteous souls waited for the gate of heaven to open through the death of Christ). Second, he was made worthy of Christ, not because of how he lived but through faith-filled, sincere repentance.

St. Dismas' life shows us how there is no saint without a dark past nor a sinner without a bright future. Some are, but not all are called to reform a religious order or become the best preacher the Church ever had. Not everyone is called to become a pope, for sure. There are so many ways to be saints, the glorious citizens of heaven. If you and I are tempted to think being saints is impossible, let's remember St. Dismas. Of course, it will require perseverance, and it won't be easy. Yet, we must never forget that we aren't created for comfort but for greatness: the imitation of Christ.

Last year's celebration was a big success. Please plan to join us this year for prayers, reflections, music and fellowship. More details to follow soon!




#### Welcome to the Family!
