

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Andrew

The fall season is indeed upon us! This year we experienced an exceptionally warm October with temperatures reaching 83 degrees on All Saints Eve! Now, however, the cold, piercing breeze surrounds us, as if trying to pull us into the winter chill. The sun setting before 5 serves as a reminder that another year is drawing to a close. As we witness the dramatic change of the season, it reminds us of one important thing: Advent is just around the corner. After today, which is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, and next Sunday, the Solemnity of Christ the King, we will celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, marking the beginning of a new liturgical year. Advent is a time for us to remember that the Lord, our King, is coming and that He is already near.

The Church teaches us that Advent is a period of preparation, directing our hearts and minds toward Christ's second coming at the end of time, as well as the anniversary of our Lord's birth at Christmas. Some may find the messages of "the end is near" or "tribulations will greet us before the Lord returns" frightening. Today's Gospel reminds us that we must always be prepared to run to the Lord upon His return. We must be ready, as the time of His return is known to nobody except the Father. Advent should not just be a season but a guiding principle in our lives, encouraging us to stay awake and welcome our Bridegroom, like the wise brides in the parable. As today's Gospel indicates, tribulation will come, the sun will be darkened, and our faith will be tested. We won't always enjoy the extended daylight, lush green forests, and blooming flowers. The end times will arrive before our Lord judges the world. Light will wane, forests will turn gray, and flowers will wither, much like they do in winter.

Some may wonder how we can find moments of joy and hope amid such uncertainty. If we must be ready to let go of the things we cherish before seeing the Lord's return, how can that be joyful? The answer is simple: what if everything we love in this earthly life—the gentle warmth of sunlight, the long days, blooming flowers, the colors of nature, the stars, and the moon—are merely visible reminders and signs of greater joy to come? What if, after enduring tribulations and darkness, the TRUE SUN is destined to rise?

Let us find joy within these challenges, for they pave the way to a deeper joy. In reality, this is the essence of our earthly existence. This is what we remember during the season of Advent. We must remember that the end times, filled with darkness and tribulations as described by Christ in today's Gospel, are not the conclusion of our story. The Son of Man, the True Light, will shine in glory, wiping away the tears of those who remain awake throughout the dark night to welcome Him.

What freezing falls and harsh winters, what darkness and tribulations are you currently facing? Whenever we might feel as though the sun is no longer shining upon us amid life's hardships, let us remember that our Lord never lies. He will come, and His light will envelop us if we continue to remain vigilant and do not fall asleep! Let us stay awake, alert, and be prepared for His coming.
