A Message from Fr. Andrew

"In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas..."

Lists of who was the ruler of which regions, who was who, who did what, who the high priests were, etc., sounds like something we would read in history textbooks. If you are more of a math and science person and don't want anything to do with history, the beginning few lines of today's Gospel might make you yawn, like Fr. Brian's Daisy does, before taking her sweet little nap. Luke seems to be playing a journalist writing a news article, emphasizing the Five W's: who, what, when, where, and why.

That is precisely what Luke was doing! Luke emphasizes what happened during Jesus' lifetime in the history of the Holy Land to provide the historical context for Jesus' life. Doing so also adds credibility to the narrative and helps readers connect God's salvation story with real-life events. The Holy Spirit inspired Luke to write the Gospel so that the story of God's love for humanity could meet them as stories that were alive and happening in their lives right next to them.

There is always a temptation to see the salvation history revealed to us in the Sacred Scripture apart from our human history. However, our God, the creator of the world, visible and invisible, is also the creator of time. Our God isn't a creator who takes His hands off this visible world after creating everything. Nor does He tell us, "Alright, now it's all on you. I am going to take a vacation now." Just like what St. Luke in the Gospel teaches us, God, who was, is, and will be, works amidst our time. His work continues through our hands, using us as His instrument to expand His Kingdom here on earth.

Of course, we've seen a dark past, and not every part of our history is as bright as the star shining above Bethlehem. There are plenty of past examples of how humanity abused the gift of free will, ultimately going off the trail. That's why we need a savior and why God continues working in our lives! Without living according to God's will to bring us to light, darkness would overcome us, filling the world with violence, division, and destruction.

The history of salvation is not just a fairytale that has nothing to do with our present lives. God hasn't taken a day off since Adam and Eve fell. Not a single day off from working to bring humanity back to Him throughout times, both bright and dark, glorious and horrid. Just like He came to us as a newborn in a manger when the chosen people were enslaved, to teach us the true meaning of freedom: Freedom from slavery to sin.

Today, God wants to work using YOUR hands to spread the Good News. So, how can you and I say yes to Him this week? What are the ways to let God bring peace and justice today and let Him use us to prove to the world that He is in charge of our time?

Two reminders: **1.** The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a holy day of obligation.




2. The feast is not about Jesus' conception but Mary's (immaculate, not miraculous):

In 1854, with the Bull Ineffabilis, Pius IX solemnly proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception: "... The Blessed Virgin Mary, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, was preserved free from every stain of original sin is a doctrine revealed by God and, for this reason, must be firmly and constantly believed by all the faithful." www.ewtn.com
