

Third Sunday of Advent

A Message from Preston Dibble, Director of Music

Rejoice again I say rejoice!

Today we celebrate Gaudete Sunday; the mid-point in our Advent journey where we rejoice. The opening prayer for today's Mass invites us to "...attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing..." Signs and symbols are everywhere today; a rose advent candle will be lit, the clergy wear rose colored vestments, our liturgical music will all speak to rejoicing as our Savior's birth is near.

At a 2012 gathering of the Italian Sacred Music Association, St. Cecilia, Pope Benedict XVI offered several thoughts on the role and importance of Sacred Music in our lives as Catholics. The Holy Father said, "Sacred music can bolster people's faith and help lapsed Catholics rediscover the beauty of God." He went further to say, "Sacred song united to words form a necessary and integral part of the solemn liturgy." Let us take a moment to consider two of those words; necessary and integral. I think those words could be applied to all music this Advent and Christmas season; Sacred or otherwise.

As much as we like to complain about Macy's playing Christmas music in November, imagine going to Macy's to do your Christmas shopping, enjoying the beauty of elaborate displays of decorations, with nothing but silence in the air – no music. Can you imagine something so foreign to us? The Holy Father is reminding us of the same here in our Liturgy. He even went a step further, "Sacred music is not an accessory or embellishment of the liturgy but is the liturgy itself."

We are truly blessed here at OLS to have such dedicated parishioners of all ages in our St. Cecilia Singers (3-8), Youth Choir (9-12), Adult Choir and cantors who lead us in song at all of our liturgies, but it is important to remember that they are not there as an accessory, or embellishment but to engage the faithful into the mysteries being celebrated. That engagement can be external as we all sing together but can also be internal as the choir offers a piece for prayerful reflection.

This Sunday is our parish's annual Carol Sing where all of our music ministry combines together in the many great texts and melodies that are the Christmas spirit! Our Youth Ministry also helps us to enjoy the nativity scene with a live nativity following the concert. The choirs at OLS truly are first rate and similar programs of music are offered at churches and concert halls throughout the month of December, but nowhere else can you engage in such musical beauty, in your own parish church with your own parishioners and without a \$35 ticket charge! I invite all parishioners, friends and family to come together this December 15th at 4PM for our Carol Sing as we truly rejoice in thanksgiving for our newborn Lord.


Welcome to the Family!

There's been a noticeable uptick in fraudulent emails. The scam involves a fake email (though often from a legitimate service such as Gmail, Yahoo, AOL, etc.) in a priest's name (or something approximating his name) making a

bizarre request. A staff member received one from a "Fr. Noodles(!)" asking that a matter be handled "discreetly."



Do **NOT** respond to these emails, and **NEVER** click on a link in these emails. Simply delete them. Please note our priests' (and parish staff) emails as listed in the bulletin. You will then be able to recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one.
