

May 12, 2024 Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

A Message from Fr. Brian

One of the cutest emails I ever received and which I have not deleted is one with the subject heading: "Things my Mother Taught Me." For example:

My mother taught me LOGIC: She used to say, "Because I said so, that's why."

My mother taught me RELIGION: When I spilled grape juice on the carpet, she said, "You better pray that stain will come out of the carpet."

My mother taught me FORESIGHT: "Make sure you wear clean underwear, in case you're in an accident."

My mother taught me about WEATHER: "It looks like a tornado swept through your room."

My mother taught me about ANTICIPATION: She'd say: "Just wait until we get home."

And my favorite: My mother taught me about JUSTICE: "One day you'll have kids ... and I hope they turn out just like you!"

To all our mothers, grandmothers, and those who "mother" us in any way, we salute you and thank you. Happy Mother's Day! We're offering all our Masses this weekend for our mothers, whether they are present with us or far away, whether they are living or deceased. Today is a beautiful day to remember them and to pray for them.

At our 10:00am Mass this Sunday, the young people of our parish will crown the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the Mother not just of Jesus, but of all of us and she is the very best of all mothers. We should continually seek her intercession in our prayers and model our own lives after her life of humility, holiness, and simplicity. The old hymn urges us to "Bring flowers of the rarest...O Mary! We crown thee with blossoms today, Queen of the Angels, Queen of the May."

This Sunday is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Until 2 years ago, this Solemnity was always celebrated on the Thursday between the 6th and 7th Sundays of Easter, 40 days after Christ's Resurrection.

Whatever your thoughts might be about this change, I offer you the official reason given for this change: the Paschal Mystery encompasses the entirety of the death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ. Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday, the Ascension of the Lord, and Pentecost are hinge feasts of the Easter Season and are important to the spiritual formation of the faithful. Therefore, celebrating the Ascension on a Sunday promotes a fuller participation in the entirety of the Easter Mysteries because of the greater number of worshipers at Sunday Masses compared to weekday Masses.

The Ascension of the Lord commemorates that historical day when 40 days after Christ's Resurrection from the dead He ascended into the glory of Heaven, taking His place at the right hand of the Father. This is a truth of our faith that we profess every Sunday at Mass when we recite the Creed. As this Sunday's Responsorial Psalm puts it, *"God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."*


The Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola have helped millions of people develop a closer relationship with God in their daily lives – here and now.


