

A Message from Fr. Brian

Harmon Killebrew was a great slugger for the Minnesota Twins. When he was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1984, he began his induction speech by paying tribute to his father. He wrote:

I grew up in this small town in Idaho, and my father used to like to go to the movies, and I'll never forget that a lot of times on warm summer evenings like this my father would take my brother, Bob, and I to the movies. And then after the movie was over, he would race us home. He'd always win. He was a man that took a great deal of pride in his children. I'll never forget, we used to play a lot of ball out in the front yard, and my mother would say, "You're tearing up the grass and digging holes in the front yard!" And my father would say, "We're not raising grass here, we're raising boys."

To all our Fathers and Grandfathers and other father figures who are busy raising kids, a very blessed and happy Father's Day! And thank you! All our Masses are being offered for our fathers, living and deceased.

On my 2nd trip to Israel, I clearly remember coming across a bush. It was enormous and as you can imagine it was quite fragrant with the smell of mustard. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed. Just as the mustard seed is something very small but grows into a very large bush, so too the Kingdom of God begins as something small but develops into something so large that it encompasses all of creation.

In our modern society, we often value what is big, splashy, and impressive. But God's Kingdom can be traced to humble beginnings: Jesus born in a humble stable. In the same way, our small acts and gestures can be the beginning of something much larger and even life changing. For example, a word of love or support to one's spouse can lead to something larger than just that moment. Our encouragement to a young person to grow in faith can be the seed that develops into something beautiful. A phone call to a friend who is grieving the death of a loved one can have a large and lasting impact. Even a thankful smile instead of a vacant stare as we approach the cashier can become the catalyst for something bigger.

These little things matter. These acts of kindness can be important because God can choose to use them to build up people in our lives and to beautify the garden of His Kingdom. God is the best of gardeners, and He knows how to multiply our little efforts and contributions into something bigger, more beautiful, and longer lasting.

As you prepare to take your summer vacation, enjoy the chance to rest, relax, and recharge. As you do so, remember that we must never take a vacation from our faith, our prayer life, or our obligation (privilege!) to attend Sunday Mass and receive the Eucharist. If we meet our goal in funds collected by June 30th, our annual assessment due to the Archdiocese will drop from 18% to 16%. This is a significant savings for our parish (about \$18,000).

SMALL GROUPS FOR ADULTS




Looking for greater depth and understanding in your prayer life?



Join Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, South Orange NJ

This pilgrimage features five nights in Rome and three nights in Assisi, with day-trips to Orvieto and Loreto along the way. Daily Mass - the cornerstone of each day - will be complemented by a touring program that immerses the pilgrims in the incredible history and culture of the Catholic Faith and Italy itself. Highlights include an Audience with the Pope in Saint Peter's Square, the Papal Basilicas of Rome, the Catacombs, the Colosseum, the Roman Forum and the Pantheon, the Duomo of Orvieto, the Basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare in Assisi and the Papal Sanctuary of the Holy House in Loreto.

Roundtrip direct airfare from New York (JFK) on Delta Airlines, and beautiful, centrally-located four star hotels have been arranged for this trip.
