

A Message from Stephanie Sonnick

Fellow parishioners,

The warm weather is finally here, and summer break is fast approaching! Many congratulations to all of you who are celebrating a new milestone. Cheers and many prayers to our newly Confirmed parishioners, to our OLS graduates and those parishioners who are graduating from other schools and moving on to high schools and colleges, and to those celebrating weddings and anniversaries. Life is on the move!

Now, let's take a look at the first reading the Church gives us to celebrate this Sunday. Most of us are familiar with what precedes this part of the story: Adam and Eve, dwelling in perfect harmony in the Garden of Eden, are beguiled by the serpent and eat of the tree of which God forbade them to eat. Today's first reading picks up in the aftermath of this cosmic event. I want to draw your attention to one epic line here in Genesis 3, which is one of my favorite lines in the Old Testament: "...the LORD God called to the man and asked him, 'Where are you?" (Gen 3:9).

This verse is epic because it teaches us something about God's nature. Think about it: God is all-powerful (omnipotent) and all-knowing (omniscient), and so in this moment in time, He undoubtedly knows where Adam is. (*Obviously! He knows everything!*) So, why does He ask this question? The LORD asks Adam this question out of His love for mankind. He speaks first; He makes the first move; through His words He invites Adam into a conversation that leads to clarity, mercy, and justice.

Friends, the Lord asks us this same question every day. He knocks on the door of your heart and of your life, and asks, "Where are you?" As a human being with free will, the choice is yours whether or not you respond. Like Adam, we are fallen. We have sinned - by what we have done and what we have failed to do – and we *need* to be restored and redeemed. God's response to that place is not to ignore us, and not to force us to accept His salvation. God's response is to see us and invite us into relationship with Him.

How do you feel called to answer His question of "Where are you?" This summer at OLS, we have two opportunities launching at the end of this month that will help you respond to God's invitation. For those seeking depth in their prayer and a closer relationship with God in daily life, <u>8</u> Weeks on the Ignatian Adventure will be a great use of your time. This guided group "retreat in daily life" will meet in-person on Monday evenings at 7pm and teach you how to use Scripture and the wisdom of Saint Ignatius to encounter the Lord in daily life. This opportunity is back by popular demand from last summer, so don't miss it!

For those seeking a good summer book and some guidance on how to bring others back into the faith (or simply to keep it), you're invited to join us for the <u>Search and Rescue</u> reading group. This eight-week group will meet virtually once a week on Wednesdays to unpack author Patrick Madrid's effective, time-tested ways to bring family and friends into (or back into) the Church described in his famous book, <u>Search and Rescue</u>.



Deadline to make goal for parish rebate: June 30, 2024


Thanks to the extremely generous contribution last week of one our parishioners, we have made our parish goal for the Annual Appeal in terms of funds pledged. However, we are still about \$9.000 short of our goal in terms of funds collected. If we meet our goal in funds collected by June 30th, our annual assessment due to the Archdiocese will drop from 18% to 16%. Because we made our goal last year, this saved the parish about \$18,000. 
Looking for greater depth and understanding in your prayer life?


Rosary Society Meeting




BABY BOTTLES REMINDER!
