

A Message from Fr. Brian

Beginning last Sunday and continuing for the following 4 Sundays, our Gospel reading comes from the 6th chapter of St. John's Gospel, which contains what is called Jesus' "Bread of Life Discourse." In this discourse, Jesus gives us His teaching about how He is the Bread of Life. I encourage you to read the entirety of John's 6th chapter (it won't take very long!). In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." He also tells us, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life."

So often, we look for bread that perishes. Some of the things that we search for are good in and of themselves: a beautiful life for our family, a nice home, a fulfilling career, good health, the list goes on and on. But sadly, we also hunger for so many other things that can be abused and which will never satisfy our hungers: material possessions, alcohol, disordered sexuality, and anything else the mind imagines. These things can never satisfy us. It is God – and He alone – who can satisfy our deepest yearnings. St. Augustine put it this way: "Our hearts are restless, O Lord, until they rest in Thee." And in this Sunday's 1st reading, we hear about how the Israelites in the desert were reminded that God alone satisfies our hunger.

If we're looking for true fulfillment, the fulfillment of all our desires, to have our deepest yearnings met, if we want to find lasting happiness, Jesus invites us to look to Him. The world, though, invites us to take the easy way out. Don't believe the lie! Don't believe the lie that we should just compromise our faith, our morals, our knowledge of what we – in the pit of our stomach – know is right and wrong, what we know is true and good. Instead, let's take to heart what St. Paul tells us in this Sunday's 2nd reading. He urges us to put aside our old selves, steeped in self-interest and sin, and put on a new self, created in Christ's image. He wrote, "Be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth."

We've all heard the old expression, "You are what you eat." Well, when we consume the Eucharist, the Bread of Life, we should become more and more like Him. We should "put on Christ." When that happens, it must lead us to bringing Him into our homes, our marriages, our families, our neighborhoods. Putting on Christ means that we should radiate His love, practice His mercy, and be His compassion to a world that so desperately needs those things.

Let's commit to living out what St. Paul and St. Augustine and so many others learned: that in being fed by Christ, by consuming Him, we are in turn consumed *by Him*, and we are then to be transformed into His very image. If we allow that to happen, we, as well as the little world in which we live, will not hunger and we will not thirst, for Jesus will be the fulfillment of all our desires.

our beautiful (and air-conditioned) church?


Welcome to the Family!
