September 15, 2024 Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows

A Message from Fr. Brian

Happy Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows! On our patronal feast day, it's worth noting that Our Blessed Mother, after whom our parish is named, was not immune from human suffering. We traditionally identify 7 sorrows of Mary:



1. The Prophecy of Simeon that a sword of sorrows would pierce her soul (Luke 2:34–35).

- 2. The Flight of the Holy Family into Egypt (Matthew 2:13).
- 3. The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem (Luke 2:43–45).
- 4. The Meeting of Mary and Jesus on his Way to Calvary.
- 5. Standing at the Foot of the Cross (John 19:25).
- 6. Jesus Being Taken Down from the Cross (Matthew 27:57–59).
- 7. The Burial of Jesus (John 19:40–42).

As we celebrate this feast day, we also celebrate and remember our parish's wonderful history. The first

church of Our Lady of Sorrows was dedicated on September 22, 1889, and stood at the corner of Academy and 4th Streets (where the current school gym is). It was a pretty, wooden structure, but by 1904 OLS had more than 1,000 parishioners and its rapid growth continued such that by the late 1920s, the original church had become too small. And so, construction on the present church



began in 1929 and it was consecrated by Newark Bishop Thomas Walsh on May 18, 1930.



In the almost 100 years since the construction of our present church, so many wonderful things have happened here: thousands of Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Weddings, and countless other celebrations, not to mention the tens of thousands of Masses celebrated here, including funeral Masses. While our parish has experienced countless joys, we've also been the place where people come to find comfort in their moments of sorrow.

As we go through life's joys and sorrows, let's never forget that we are accompanied by our Blessed Mother. She too knew the amazing joys that life can offer us, but she also knew suffering and sorrow. Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside Jesus as He gave His life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of His

passion as only a mother can. Mary, of course, is Mother not only to Jesus, but to all of humanity. And she continues to suffer and sorrow over the sorrows that we face, and she watches over us with a mother's love as we endure life's sorrows. May our Blessed Mother, under her title of Our Lady of Sorrows, continue to watch over our parish family and may we continually seek refuge under her mantle.

Attention Parents of All Students Celebrating the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist This School Year

Parents of all students in the parish who will be celebrating the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist this year are asked to attend one of two upcoming *mandatory* First Reconciliation parent meetings via Zoom. These very important information sessions will provide parents with an overview of the home-based sacramental preparation program used here at Our Lady of Sorrows.

Parent resource materials, student workbooks, review sheets and registration forms will be distributed in advance of the meetings at CCD and through the OLS School. In order to receive the sacraments this year, your child must have attended a Catholic school or religious education program in the previous year and be currently enrolled. This is the policy of the Archdiocese of Newark. At least one parent must attend one of the two following meetings:

Thursday afternoon, September 26, 2024 at 1:00 - 2:15 pm, via Zoom *OR* Thursday evening, September 26, 2024 at 7:00 - 8:15 pm, via Zoom

All families of our sacramental preparation students should also plan on attending our First Reconciliation Inscription Mass. This Mass will be held at the upcoming Family Mass on Sunday, October 6th at 10:00 am. A First Reconciliation activity will follow in St. Joseph's Hall immediately after Mass.

We look forward to helping your children begin the next important step in their sacramental journeys.
