

A Message from Fr. Andrew

Hate the sin but love the sinner. These are the words familiar to many Christians because this is the way of God. God loves us, sinners, but hates our sins because sins hinder our relationship with Him and our neighbors. Isn't that why Jesus, in the Gospel of John, tells a sinful woman, *"Neither do I condemn you,"* but adds, *"Go, and from now on, do not sin anymore"* as He forgives her (John 8:11) He embraces the woman's deepest wounds and heals them. But Jesus makes sure to teach her never to return to the old way of life.

God's love for us can be tough. We see this even in how He saved us: giving us His only Begotten Son as a perfect and unblemished sacrificial lamb! He bridged an unbridgeable gap between us and Himself by paying an unimaginably expensive cost. With that, He never wants to lose any soul, showing us the immense value, He places on each of us.

God's desire to lead us to heaven is well expressed in today's Gospel. Jesus loves us. However, when teaching us about how to battle sins, He asks us to leave no space for devils to have a grip on us. *"If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off! And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off!"* These are challenging words to digest. Does God want His Kingdom filled with His children without hands and feet? That is not what He is saying here. Jesus is talking about the importance of our determination to live out the life as a disciple by loving good and hating evil. This way of life must also be translated into our care for one another, especially within our Christian communities.

Of course, we are not born without original sin like the Blessed Mother. We will be tempted, and we may fall. But we must think about what the root causes of our sins are, especially if they are habitual. The first way of fighting the temptation is to avoid the near occasions. If impulse buying and wasting our money is our struggle, perhaps the best way to fight that temptation is to avoid walking on a street filled with luxury brand stores. What are our struggles, and how can we have our eyes fixed on heaven? If heaven feels too much of a high place to have our eyes fixed on, then try this: look at the crucifix and see what the Lord had done for us first before thinking He is asking too much of us.


