#### A Message from Fr. Andrew

There is an old saying, "You don't choose a saint; the *saint chooses you*," and I cannot agree with this statement more. This saying tells us that we might think we are the ones who choose to have devotion to certain saints, but in fact, it is the other way around. It is the saints in heaven choosing us to join heaven by sharing the similar hearts they had on earth. Isn't it beautiful to see how all of us, the members of the Holy Church, are united wherever we are!?

On that note, St. Andrew the Apostle is my favorite saint. In a way, he chose me to love the Lord like he did two thousand years ago. I am not in love with him simply because I am named Andrew. I love him because of what he did.

Andrew the Apostle was no one else but a humble fisherman. He probably smelled terrible after the long day of fishing in the Sea of Galilee under the sizzling sun of the Middle East, and his hands were probably covered with scars and calluses because of all the pulling and throwing of the heavy fishing nets. However, in his humility, he believes in the words of John the Baptist that taught Him Jesus was the Lamb of God they had been waiting for years.

After spending some time with Jesus where He was staying, Andrew couldn't help but try to share the same experience with his older brother, Simon Peter. This is what I love about Andrew. He experiences the warmth of Christ's presence and brings others to that same love he once received. It was only then that Peter started following Christ, making Him the Church's first pope.

Although being one of the first ones to follow Christ, Andrew the Apostle doesn't demand Jesus to make him the head of the apostles. All he does is meet Christ, have his heart touched by that first encounter, and bring those around him to the presence of Christ. What a beautiful way of living, and what a noble humility!

As Pope Benedict XVI once taught, we are not created to seek comfort but for greatness. However, we must revisit what greatness means. The world often tells us to be great, in the sense of encouraging us to try to become the powerful Marvel Hero and a Savior. But the truth is, there is no savior but Jesus Christ. Therefore, the only path towards greatness for us is to first stay near Him, accept His love and graces, and become the instrument of God, bringing others around us and entrusting them at His feet.

That is what our Lord is asking us to do starting today. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves. We must share it with others, just like Andrew the Apostle invited his brother to see Jesus. How? It all begins with a simple invitation to those around us:

"I have found Messiah; His name is Jesus. No one else loves me more than He does, and He died on the Cross for Me. He wants to do the same for you. Would you like to meet Him and find out the true meaning of your life?"

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2023, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans
