January 19, 2020 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message From Fr. Brian

As you know, the liturgical season of Christmas has ended and we are now in Ordinary Time, which will continue until Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 26 this year). During this "Ordinary" time, we should remember that each of us, as a disciple of Christ, is called to live an *extraordinary* life.

Do you know what's ordinary? A life of sin, a life of giving in to the current trend, of surrendering to our desires, of living only for ourselves. An *extraordinary* life, on the other hand, is one which takes account of God's daily presence in our lives, which talks to God every day in prayer, which seeks to follow God's commandments, which strives to share one's faith with those without true faith, which focuses on being God's servant as our readings this weekend encourage, and which looks to Our Blessed Mother and the saints as our models of holiness.

Perhaps we should begin taking on the attitude of Isaiah in our 1st reading: "I am made glorious in the sight of the LORD, and my God is now my strength!" You are glorious in the eyes of God! Nothing can change that. God is your strength! You don't need to rely only on yourself.

Or perhaps we should look to St. Paul, who in our 2nd reading wrote of himself as "an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God" and who said that we "have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy." We are called to be a disciple of Christ and to seek holiness!

Then there's St. John the Baptist, who in our Gospel admitted that he was preparing for and proclaiming a person whom he didn't really even know. We must proclaim Christ, who we do know, to everyone who doesn't know Him!

What are we, who way too often think of ourselves as just ordinary, to make of these examples of "ordinary people" who wound up doing extraordinary things and living extraordinary lives? Perhaps each of them, somewhere along the way, prayed what the Psalmist prays in this Sunday's liturgy: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

A few other thoughts and items to keep in mind this week...

- Martin Luther King day is this Monday, January 20th, and it is an Archdiocesan holiday. We will have only one Mass that day, at 9:00 am in the Upper Church. Let us pray for racial harmony in our nation, that all Americans will "not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character."
- We will pray a Eucharistic Holy Hour this Wednesday, January 22nd, at 7:00 pm. This Wednesday is the 47th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision permitting the horror of abortion. During our Holy Hour, we will pray for the protection of all human life, from conception to natural death.
- We encourage everyone to bring your home Bible to Church next weekend (January 25-26). Pope Francis has declared that henceforth the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time will be called "Word of God Sunday." At the end of Masses next weekend, we will have a special blessing for your Bible. If you don't have a Bible at home, perhaps God is calling you to get one now! If you have multiple Bibles, bring all of them!
- Mark your calendars for Saturday, February 8th. We will be have a "Wine and Cheese Happy Hour," beginning at 6:30 pm at the Elks Lodge (across from the Church). This will be a relaxed and enjoyable evening where you can enjoy the company of your fellow parishioners. See next week's bulletin, our weekly eblast, and our Facebook page for further information.




