

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

### A Message from Fr. Brian

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord. Throughout most of the world, this Feast is celebrated with as much or even more festivity as Christmas. Having lived in Rome for 9 years, I quickly learned the peculiar way that the Italians celebrate Epiphany. Their celebration includes the legend of a white-haired, good witch known as "La

Befana." According to the legend, the night before the Wise Men gave the Baby Jesus their gifts, they stopped at the home of an old woman and invited her to come along but she said that she was too busy. Later on, she realized that she had made a mistake and so she decided to join the Wise Men. But she got lost and, as tradition has it, she now flies around on her broomstick on the night of January 5th looking for the manger in



hopes of finding the Baby Jesus, but not being able to find Him, she gives her presents to any Italian child who leaves out a shoe or hangs up a stocking on Epiphany Eve. Rome's Epiphany tradition also includes a procession of thousands of people dressed in medieval costumes who walk along the wide avenue leading up to the Vatican, carrying symbolic gifts for the Pope. This imitates the Wise Men bearing gifts for Jesus.

Many other countries throughout the world also have their own special Epiphany traditions. But here in the United States, Epiphany has unfortunately become almost neglected, as we stop thinking about the birth and manifestation of Jesus already by December 26<sup>th</sup>. But that won't be the case here at OLS. We won't neglect the Epiphany. We'll celebrate it, because it means that God, in His great goodness and love, continues to show Himself to us.

It may soon be time to take down the Christmas tree, to put away the decorations and to pack up the manger. But this fact we should not pack up and put away: that Jesus came into this world, He manifested Himself to us, and He remains in this world in the most ordinary things of our daily life. Our job is to recognize His daily epiphanies, adore Him, and bring Him the treasure of ourselves. The Psalmist this weekend writes, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." It would be wonderful if every nation on earth adored Our Lord, but whether that's the case or not, as individuals we should, like the Wise Men, always seek out the Lord and adore Him.

### Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables.

- Saturday: 8:00-6:00 Church front vestibule

- Sunday: 8:00-12:00 Church front vestibule
- Please do not leave food at the Rectory.
