

# A Message from Fr. Brian

Years ago, and long before I entered the seminary, I was on a ferry boat crossing the English Channel from Dover, UK to Calais, France, which takes about 2 hours. I was with the pastor of the parish church I attended at that time, as well as 2 other young guys. At some point, I became bored or restless and I told my pastor that I was going to get up and walk around the boat to "kill some time." You would have thought that I had told him I was going to kill a person because he became very serious, sternly telling me that I should never think about time as something that should be killed since all time is a gift from God. Honestly, I thought he overreacted a bit, but the message stayed with me. Time is sacred because it was created by God and God has gifted us with it.

Each of our readings this Sunday speaks to us about how we use the time that we have been given. In the 1<sup>st</sup> reading, Jonah was given the mission of announcing to the Ninevites that they have a short time to repent of their sins and return to God. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, St. Paul wrote that "time is running out." And in the Gospel, the very first words that Jesus uttered in Mark's Gospel is about time. He said, "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." So, we see a real sense of urgency in these readings.

We began the liturgical season of Ordinary Time last Sunday and it will continue until Ash Wednesday, which falls very early this year: February 14<sup>th</sup> (Valentine's Day!). After the liturgical seasons of Lent and Easter, we will re-commence Ordinary Time on May 20<sup>th</sup>, which will continue until next Advent, which this year begins on December 1, 2024.

Of course, we should never think of time as "ordinary." We use the term "Ordinary Time" to refer to the fact that the life of the Church is ordered during those weeks when we live our lives neither in penance (Advent and Lent) nor in feasting (the Christmas and Easter seasons). During these days of "Ordinary Time," we focus on the fact that Jesus walks among us in the ordinariness of our lives and that we should allow Him to transform our lives.

The evil one, Satan, fools us though and tells us many lies about time. One way is by whispering to us that we don't have enough time to pray, or to read Scripture, or to get involved in the life of the Church, or to forgive others, or to repent of our own sins (telling us that our sins aren't serious or that we don't need to go to Confession). He also tells us that "my time belongs to me," which stops us from reaching out in charity to help the suffering world around me. On the other hand, he also tempts us to become overly fixated on our past: our past failures, our past sins. He also encourages us not to forget those times in the past when others have hurt us.

This past week, I buried my 28-year-old nephew Sean. His death is proof that life can be short, that time is precious, that time should never be "killed," that time is sacred, and that we've each been given a certain amount of time in this world to do as the disciples did in this Sunday's Gospel and leave behind our own "nets," to fully repent of our sins, to follow Jesus, to love, to forgive, to pray, to glorify God by means of a life lived in His grace and love, and to build up the Kingdom of God on earth. In the 1960s, the Rolling Stones came out with the song, "Time is on my side." Let's make sure that our lives prove that!



#### OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2023, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4th Street entrance or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning.
