#### Message from Fr. Brian

Big game this Saturday evening! The Giants vs. the Eagles in the playoffs. I suspect that among those of us who are football fans, most will be rooting for the Giants, but I also know that we have a good number of diehard Eagles fans in our parish. No matter who you're rooting for, we know that football is a team sport, and that teamwork is so important to success. Both teams are good, but we know that if the members of the team aren't united, then the whole team will suffer.

And that's the message of St. Paul in our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading this weekend. The Church is like a team. Paul says, "I urge you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose."

If the individual players on the Giants or the Eagles were not of the same mind and the same purpose with their teams, then obviously their teams won't advance to the NFC Championship game. A team needs unity of mind and purpose. So too does the Church.

Imagine yourself being on a football team (or baseball team or soccer team or any other type of team) and everyone else on the team is counting on you to do your job well, to play at your highest level for the sake of the whole team, to have the same mind and purpose as the other players on the team. If you knew the rest of the team was counting on you, and if you knew that your contribution to the team is critical, then you'd try your hardest and work your hardest to help the team reach its glory.

If we can imagine ourselves in that type of situation, then we should also be able to see ourselves as being indispensable members of another team, that is, the Church. We should be able to see that when we don't put in an honest effort at being an essential member of the Church, when we aren't united with the Church and of one mind and purpose with the Church, then all the members of the Church suffer from that and the Church herself suffers.

All too often, we think to ourselves: "Let somebody else do it. The job, the mission can be accomplished without me. I'll just play my small role by going to Sunday Mass. I'm too weak, too poor, too busy, too old, too young, too whatever." That's selling ourselves short and that's not good for the team. We're better than that and when we join together in mind and purpose, wonderful things happen. Just look at the work and ministry of our Food Pantry, our St. Vincent de Paul Society, our parish school, our CCD office, our Knights of Columbus council, our Rosary Society, and the list goes on and on.

I realize that so many of you already give so much of your time, treasure and talent to the Church and to her mission. God's sees your contribution and all of us are grateful for it. I'm not making a general call to encourage you to join in some parish group or ministry (though I would love for that to happen!).

Rather, I want to encourage you to see yourselves as valued members of this great mystery that we call the Church. I want you to see yourselves as strong, even in your weakness; as rich, even in your poverty; as powerful, even in your suffering.

And when you see yourselves that way, as indispensable members of the Church, I'm hoping you'll pray to God asking Him to help you to know how to bring forth the treasury of who you are for the benefit of the entire Body of Christ and demonstrate to the rest of us that you are an invaluable member of the real Super Bowl team, the Church. Stay tuned to future issues of the bulletin to see how you might do that at OLS!

#### Knights of Columbus have been busy!

The OLS Council of the Knights of Columbus, which is called the Regina Pacis Council (Queen of Peace) has been and will continue to be very active! Highlights from 2022 include:

- September 11: Knights set up and took down tables, chairs, etc. for the OLS parish picnic. Maybe you saw them at the picnic. Many Knights attended the picnic wearing their new custom-made Regina Pacis KofC polo shirts.
- November 20: After a 3-year hiatus due to Covid, the Knights gathered at OLS for the annual Memorial Mass for the seventeen council members who died since the last Memorial Mass. Lou Budzyn led the group in the recitation of the Rosary prior to the Mass.
- The Council supported food pantries at both Our Lady of Sorrows and St.
   Joseph's. The Knights donated 20 turkeys to St. Joseph's for the holiday, and teamed
   up with the Valley Road School in Clark, NJ to obtain and deliver a truckload of food to
   Our Lady of Sorrows. Also, on November 5, 2022, several Knights, led by Pete Morin,
   assisted the OLS food pantry by setting up food for distribution.
- December 2: The Knight's Christmas party was an enjoyable night with delicious food and great company. The "red rug" gift auction fundraiser was a tremendous success, raising over \$1,600.00 for charity.
- December 3: The Knight's free throw competition for boys and girls ages 9-14 was held at the OLS gym. Several children were awarded age group awards and will be eligible to compete in the next level of the State-wide competition.
- Other highlights for the Regina Pacis Council, which relocated from St. Joseph Church to OLS in 2022, were the induction of several new members in CUF (Charity, Unity & Fraternity) degrees, the setting up of a Knights Facebook page by Pete Morin (see Knights of Columbus #4066 Regina Pacis), and the appointment of Knights to support our Grand Knight, David Luciano, by leading the various council committees: Spirituality (Len Mrozak), Youth (Lou Budzyn), Community (Peter Morin), and Membership (John Becht), and the appointment of John Robertson to take the meeting Minutes.

Upcoming events for the Regina Pacis Knights of Columbus Council include:

- Our next Council meeting is February 13, 2023, at 7:00 pm at OLS in the lower chapel.
- The Knights will offer assistance for running of the "February Frenzy" basketball tournament at the Our Lady of Sorrows School.
- The Nights will carry out the 2023 plans of the OLS St. Gianna Pro Life ministry, including a "baby bottle" fundraising campaign and a fundraiser for a pregnancy care center.
- A Lenten retreat sponsored by the Knights is planned for March 25, 2023, at the Sisters of Charity Mendham Convent, from 9 to 3pm, featuring speaker Allan Wright. See future bulletins for more information.
