3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Brian

Deacon Walter Wiggins began his wonderful homily at our 11:30 Sunday Mass on January 16 by quoting from the website "Learn Religions," which describes the nature of the liturgical season of "Ordinary Time." (You can view Deacon Walter's entire homily on our parish YouTube channel.)

We began that liturgical season last Sunday and it will continue until Ash Wednesday on March 2^{nd} . Deacon Walter quoted the following:

"Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) nor in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ...Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!"

Indeed, there is nothing "ordinary" about Christ continually walking among us and there is nothing "ordinary" about time itself. In our 1st reading for this Sunday's Mass, we hear the line "today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!" Every single day is holy to God, for He created it, and we should find reasons to rejoice every day, even amidst the many challenges and struggles we daily face.

One day that was very sad for this nation was January 22, 1973, the date of the Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion. Every day since then, pro-life advocates have worked tirelessly to overturn that decision and have won many victories that are a cause for rejoicing. But there's still much work left to ensure that every human life is respected and defended, from conception until natural death. More than 800,000 pregnancies are aborted every year in the United States and 18% of all pregnancies end in abortion. So, yes, there is still much work that must be done to educate our fellow citizens on the sanctity of human life. On Friday, January 20th, hundreds of thousands of people gathered in Washington, D.C. to give witness to their belief that God is the author of human life and that God alone has the power to take human life.

This coming **Wednesday, January 25th at 7:00 pm**, OLS will have a Holy Hour for Life. We'll pray that our nation will respect life in all stages of development. We will pray for expectant mothers to choose life for their babies. We will pray for men, that they'll understand their role is to be guardians and defenders of life; that men will be responsible husbands and fathers; that they will understand that fatherhood, like motherhood, begins at the moment of conception. We will pray for doctors and nurses, that they will use their skills not to take life, but to serve life. And we will pray for politicians, that they'll stand up for this most fundamental of human rights.


PLEASE, join us this **Wednesday at 7:00 pm**, as we pray before Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Two other days that I wish to call your attention to are **February 2** (**Wednesday at 7:00 pm**) and **February 13** (**Sunday at 12:30**). We will have "listening sessions" on both of these days that will give you an opportunity to offer your thoughts on the state of our parish, the Archdiocese, and universal Catholic Church (see the flyer on the next page for further information). These listening sessions are being held in response to the Archdiocese's desire that parishes participate in the Catholic Church's "Synod on Synodality" (admittedly, a confusing title for the Church's universal Synod). Even before the Archdiocese requested that parishes hold listening sessions as part of the Synod, it was my desire – in consultation with our Pastoral Council – to solicit your input about how you view our parish and what your hopes and dreams are for OLS.

Please plan to join us for one of these listening sessions. This is your parish and my own hope and prayer is that every parishioners will desire to become more fully involved and invested in the life of our parish. We want to build upon what we already do well and introduce more ministry opportunities as needs arise. Your input is needed as we discern where OLS currently is, what we do well already, and areas where we need to continue to grow. This is a great chance for every parishioners to embrace the idea of taking greater ownership of our parish and one's own faith journey. So, please mark your calendars for either: **February 2 (Wednesday at 7:00 pm) or February 13 (Sunday at 12:30).** The meetings will be in St. Joseph's Hall (the lower level of the Church).
