Message from Stephanie Sonnick, Ministerial Associate

Hello! My name is Stephanie Sonnick, and recently joined the Pastoral team at Our Lady of Sorrows. Like many of you, I'm a New Jersey native: I was born and raised in Ridgewood (Bergen County) and am one of four children. I grew up attending public schools, playing sports, and spending a lot of time visiting extended family in Queens and the Bronx. I left the area to attend college at the University of Notre Dame, where I encountered the faith alive in my classes and student life. I was getting to know Jesus more personally: for the first time in my life, Sunday Mass started to make sense to me, and I realized that God had a plan

for my life! I felt called to grow in my faith and learn how to assist other people to do the same.

After graduating with degrees in Theology and Spanish, I did a two-year graduate program for ministry called Echo and worked in a parish in Indianapolis, helping with adult formation, Hispanic ministry, women's ministry, and lots of translating from English to Spanish! I moved back to New Jersey when that program concluded and started working in Campus Ministry at Seton Hall University where I stayed for five years.

I'm excited to be a part of this great community and team here at OLS! I will be serving as your Ministry Associate to support this community to nurture and grow various ministries within the parish (women's ministry, adult formation, young adults, bereavement, etc.). I'm really looking forward to getting to know you and your families as we walk this journey of faith together. Speaking of journey of faith, I'm excited to partner with Fr. Brian to facilitate some parish small groups this upcoming Lenten season. On



the Tuesday evenings of Lent, we are offering a 5-week video series called "A Biblical Walk through the Mass." This will be a great way to connect with others in the parish and to spend time intentionally growing in faith this Lent. Stewardship Reflections

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." MATTHEW 5:3

The phrase "poor in spirit" can be confusing. Think of it in this sense – poor in spirt means depending on God's providence and not depending on our own self-reliance. Being detached from earthy things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.

OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables. **Food donations can be dropped off:**

- Monday-Friday: 9:30-4:00 4th Street entrance (lower Church – buzz to be let in)
- Saturday: 8:00-6:00 Church front vestibule
- Sunday: 8:00-12:00 Church front vestibule
- Please do not leave food at the Rectory.

Email scams involving clergy

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from one of our priests, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply asking you to reply).

A number of parishes have been hit with these email scams. It involves making a fake Gmail (or Yahoo, etc.) account in a priest's name and then sending you a request of some sort from that priest. The emails may seem harmless; they have the priest's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually different from the one the priest uses. In some instances, the priest's name may look correct but is missing just a single letter.

Please do not respond or reply to these emails and never click on a link in these emails. Simply delete them. You will recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one. Also, note that the correct email addresses of our priests and parish staff are always published in the weekly bulletin.


