# A Message from Fr. Brian

*"Faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love."* Those words from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians are often heard at weddings, as couples pledge their mutual love to each other. But we'll also hear them at Mass this Sunday during the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading. Love is, of course, not just something shared by newlyweds, but we are all called to love. And our love must not be limited to just our family and closest friends, but must also extend to everyone, for we are all God's children.

One of the ways we can demonstrate our love for all of God's children is through our participation in the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Many of you have already received a letter from Cardinal Tobin appealing to your generosity to contribute to this Appeal. Please prayerfully consider making a gift to the Appeal, which serves so many needs throughout the Archdiocese (listed below).

During last year's Appeal, you really came through in a marvelous way! Our parish goal was \$75,607 and our parish pledged \$100,696, which means that we will very soon receive a check from the Archdiocese in the amount of \$25,089 (the parish receives 100% of every contribution over our goal). Last year's Appeal result was nearly double the amount contributed to the 2020 Appeal, when our parish contributed \$50,694 (we therefore did not receive a rebate from the Archdiocese since we missed our goal). Last year, 162 of our parishioners contributed to the Appeal, compared to 124 in 2020.

Another benefit of making our goal is that the assessment rate that we pay to the Archdiocese was reduced by 2%, meaning that the parish will owe \$14,000 <u>less</u> to the Archdiocese in assessments than we owed the previous year. That's a big savings for the parish!

As you can see, when we meet and exceed our goal, the benefits to the parish are enormous (nearly \$40,000 for OLS last year!). But the Appeal benefits not just our parish, but so many people and ministries throughout our 4-county Archdiocese. The ministries funded by the Appeal are organized into four different groups:
