

# January 7, 2024 The Epiphany of the Lord

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, which marks the end of the Christmas liturgical season. The word epiphany is a Greek word, and it means a manifestation of some type. On this Feast, we celebrate the manifestation of Jesus to the visitors from the East, who we often refer to as the 3 Kings, the Magi, or the Wise Men.

Another way we could use the word epiphany is in reference to the manifestation of so many people who helped to make Christmas at OLS so wonderful. We are incredibly blessed in this parish by the many people who constantly give of themselves to make OLS such a special place. Allow me to thank some of these people.

- Our church is always an incredibly beautiful building, but it looks especially magnificent at Christmas (and Easter). Thank you to those who helped to decorate this year: Dorothy lantosca, Mary Loeser and her 3 grandchildren, Mary Chris Brauchli, and Maria Civile. Great job!
- We are blessed by our parish maintenance crew. Led by Marvin Reyes, this crew includes Sam Lewis and Julio Herrera. They were assisted this year by Robert Budzyn and Patrick McDonald. They put up the 8 live trees in the church and other parish buildings. They also put up the massive live wreaths on the inside columns of the church as well as the wreaths on the exterior doors, the flags that fly from the columns, and our 3 Nativity scenes: in the church, in front of the rectory, and near the 4<sup>th</sup> Street entrance. By the way, the Nativity scene in the Church will remain up until the Feast of the Presentation, which is February 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Our amazing music ministry, led by Preston Dibble, our organist and Director of Music. We had a marvelous Christmas Carol Sing on December 17<sup>th</sup>, and we experienced beautiful music at our Christmas Eve and Day Masses. Our immense gratitude goes out to the members of our choirs, including our children's choir and our youth choir. Thank you for sharing your talent with us!
- Our Youth Group, which is guided by Chris Kaiser. Members of our Youth Group helped us with the Live Nativity Scene in front of the rectory during the Carol Sing. They were dressed as Mary and Joseph and as shepherds (which was appropriate, given that they looked after the live sheep and donkey and alpaca!).
- Our Religious Education Department, under the direction of Jen Noll and Colleen McDonald, put on a wonderful children's Christmas pageant. Thank you to the director of the pageant, Alonzo Gallo, as well as Carol Gallo, Gabe Baseman, Eileen Pucillo, Margaret Johnston, Rebecca Noll, Nancy Piasecki, Tierney Norris, Kathryne Squilla, as well as members of our parish choirs. Our gratitude goes especially to the children of the parish who participated in the Pageant. They reminded us of the real reason we celebrate Christmas. I am moved every year by this humble and simple presentation of the Lord's entry into human history. Thanks also to Liz Ebert for organizing the pizza party afterward!
- You! Thank you to the more than 2,000 of you for your presence at Christmas Masses! It looks like our attendance is back to the pre-pandemic levels, which is great news! And thank you for your Christmas gifts to the parish. As I write this (on December 26<sup>th</sup>!), I don't know the amount of our Christmas collection (and it's not too late to add to it!), but whatever it is I know that it will help us very much throughout 2024 in our mission of making Jesus better known, loved, and served. Thank you!

# Sponsor Certificates - A reminder

To receive a Sponsor Certificate for Baptism or Confirmation, you must be registered in the parish for a minimum of six months. Sponsor Certificates indicate that the individual is a registered member of our parish and is a practicing Catholic and has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

#### Email scams involving clergy

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from one of our priests, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply asking you to reply).

A number of parishes have been hit with these email scams. It involves making a fake Gmail (or Yahoo, etc.) account in a priest's name and then sending you a request of some sort from that priest. The emails may seem harmless; they have the priest's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually different from the one the priest uses. In some instances, the priest's name may look correct but is missing just a single letter.

<u>Please do not respond or reply to these</u> <u>emails and never click on a link in these</u> <u>emails.</u> Simply delete them. You will recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one. Also, note that the correct email addresses of our priests and parish staff are always published in the weekly bulletin.

#### Hospital Privacy

Privacy laws regarding patients in hospitals do not allow hospitals to contact parishes if their parishioners are in the hospital. If you or a loved one are going into the hospital and you desire that a priest visit you or your loved one, please call the rectory office and let us know.

#### Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2023, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

stocked with basic arocerv items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar). pasta and sauce. peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken



and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4<sup>th</sup> Street entrance or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning.
