The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Message from Fr. Brian

The cover of today's bulletin is a photo of the beautiful image near the organ in our church. It shows the Solemnity that we celebrate today, that is the Epiphany of the Lord. An epiphany is a manifestation of any type, but the manifestation we celebrate today is that of Jesus to the gentile visitors from the East, who we often refer to as the 3 King, the Magi, or the Wise Men.

Throughout most of the world, the the Epiphany is celebrated with as much or even more festivity as Christmas. Having lived in Rome for 9 years, I quickly learned the peculiar way that the Italians celebrate Epiphany. Their celebration includes the legend of a white-haired, good witch known as "La Befana." According to the legend, the night before the Wise Men gave the Baby Jesus their gifts, they stopped at the home of an old woman and invited her to come along but she said that she was too busy. Later on, she realized that she had made a mistake and so she decided to join the Wise Men. But she got lost and so she now flies around on her broomstick on the 11th night of Christmas, bringing gifts to children in hopes that she might find the Baby Jesus.

Rome's Epiphany tradition also includes a procession of thousands of people dressed in medieval costumes who walk along the wide avenue leading up to the Vatican, carrying symbolic gifts. This imitates the Wise Men bearing gifts for Jesus.

Here in the United States, Epiphany has unfortunately become almost neglected, as we stop thinking about the birth and manifestation of Jesus already by December 26th. But we must celebrate it because it means that God, in His great goodness and love, continues to show Himself to us, as He did those 3 Magi.

One wonders how the Wise Men felt when they finally reached Bethlehem and found Jesus. What were their emotions, their sentiments? Well, one sentiment was awe and adoration. The Gospel tells us they knelt before the Infant Jesus in the arms of His mother. Another emotion would have been gratitude, as they presented the little Baby with those gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

But think about it. Would they not also have been surprised? Would not those Wise Men have been shocked to find the King they were seeking...hidden away in a stable?

Here they are waiting for some sign to announce the Savior of the world. They finally discover that sign; it's a shining star and they follow its beam. Finally, their search is over and they find...a baby? Not a king in a palace, but a baby in a stable. Seated not on a throne, but cuddled in the arms of His mother.

This is not what they expected. And this is one of the lessons of this Feast of the Epiphany: The Divine is usually found where we least expect it. We normally look for the Divine in the dramatic, the miraculous, the extraordinary, the earth-shaking. But the Divine, more often than not, is found in the quiet, the simple, the ordinary, the day-in and day-out things of life. Divinity is usually found where we least expect it.

It may be time to take down the Christmas tree, to put away the decorations and to pack up the manger (though here in our church we'll keep up the manger until February 3, the Feast of the Presentation). But this fact we should not pack up and put away: Jesus came into this world, He manifested Himself to us, and He remains in this world in the most ordinary things of our daily life. Our job is to recognize His daily epiphanies and then bring Him the treasure of ourselves.


