

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

A Message from Fr. Brian

In our secular culture, the Christmas Season seems to begin right after Halloween and it ends on December 26th, when the Christmas music stops playing nonstop on the radio and the first Christmas trees show up on the tree lawn. But the *liturgical* season of Christmas begins only on Christmas Eve and it doesn't end until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which we celebrate this Sunday.

Historically, the Christmas season extends for an even longer period, long past the Baptism of the Lord. Traditionally the Feast of Candlemas (also called the Presentation of the Lord), which occurs on February 2, marked the final conclusion of the Christmas cycle. Candlemas celebrates the event that occurred 40 days after Jesus' birth when His parents presented Him in the Temple. Following that tradition, which is very common in countries outside the United States, we will leave the *crèche* (the Nativity Scene) displayed in our church until February 2nd.

Given that we're just now ending the Christmas Season, allow me this opportunity to thank those who made Christmas so special at OLS. This year, on December 12th, we celebrated our very first children's Christmas Pageant. You're probably saying, "We've had those before!" No, the previous 40 years' version of the Pageant was always an Epiphany Pageant. The children of our parish helped to remind us of the true essence of Christmas and did so in such a marvelously charming way! Special thanks to Jen Noll and Colleen McDonald from our Religious Education program, as well as Alonzo Gall, the Director of the Pageant, Liz Ebert, and JoAnn Hankey.

On December 19th, our OLS music ministry held its annual Carol Sing. Led by Preston Dibble, our Director of Music, our 3 amazing OLS choirs (adult, youth, and children's), accompanied by the Gramercy Brass Quintet as well as percussion, harp, and flute, inspired us with what was, in my own opinion, the best Christmas concert I've ever attended (and I've been to a lot of them over the years!). The Carol Sing helped to focus our hearts and souls on the great and beautiful mystery of the Incarnation and Birth of Christ our Lord. Our choirs also sang so beautifully at the 4:30 pm and 10:00 pm Christmas Eve Masses and the 11:30 am Christmas Day Mass. How blessed (and spoiled!) we are at OLS to have such an accomplished music ministry!

Our Church looked so beautiful for Christmas and that didn't happen all by itself! Our deep gratitude to those who helped to decorate the Church, including Dottie Iantosca, Carol Zipso DeMeo, Mary Loeser, and Joyce Ashurst, as well as our wonderful maintenance personnel Marvin Reyes and Julio Herrera. We of course have an amazing Church in which we worship, but it becomes even more wonderful when decorated for Christmas (and Easter). Again, we are blessed (and spoiled!) to have such a wonderful worship space!

I would be remiss if I didn't thank all of you who attended our Christmas events and Masses, either in person or virtually. And, once again, thank you for your financial support of our parish. As I write this column (on Dec. 28th), our Christmas collection has not yet reached its goal (which was arrived at by using last year's Christmas collection amount). Thank you for your generosity to this collection. And, please, continue to remember our parish going forward. All that we do at OLS, including at Christmas, requires an ongoing commitment of time, treasure, and talent from you, our parishioners.

I wish all of you a very blessed, happy, holy, and healthy New Year, filled with many graces and blessings. May Christ be our constant companion throughout 2022 and may we continually turn to Mary for her maternal protection over us and our loved ones.

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables.

- Monday-Friday: 9:30-4:00 4th Street entrance (lower Church – buzz to be let in)
- Saturday: 8:00-6:00 Church front vestibule

Food donations can be dropped off:

- Sunday: 8:00-12:00 Church front vestibule
- Please do not leave food at the Rectory.
