

A Message from Fr. Brian

The people that Jesus so often ministered to and hung out with were the public sinners: the tax collectors and the prostitutes. They had jobs or professions that made them complete outcasts. In Jesus' day, they were viewed as collaborators with the Romans. They profited from their dealings with the despised Roman rulers and the Roman soldiers.

Tax collectors took advantage of the Jewish people. Every aspect of their lives was scrutinized and taxed by the Roman authorities. Every shekel paid was a cruel reminder of Israel's defeat and the loss of the Jewish political identity.

As for prostitutes, they violated their own sexual purity, to be sure. But their existence also threatened the genetic purity of the Jewish race itself. According to Mosaic law, any child born of a Jewish mother was considered Jewish. But the "chosen people," the Jewish race was being diluted because Roman blood was being introduced into the offspring of the prostitutes.

Yet it was these two groups, one the most dangerous and the other the most shunned, that in this Sunday's Gospel Jesus singled out and elevated above "the chief priests and elders of the people." It was the ultimate insult. He told the chief priests and the elders that the tax collectors and prostitutes would be entering the kingdom of God before they would. What an insult! Jesus never pulled any punches, did He?

And He used the parable of the two sons to make His case. In the parable, a man had two sons. The first son said "no" to his father, but he eventually went and did what his father wanted. That son represents sinners, including tax collectors and prostitutes, who initially say "no" to God, but who, upon encountering Jesus, are open to His message. They undergo conversion.

The second son said "yes" to the father, but in the end he didn't deliver. He represents the religious authorities of the day who were long on words but short on deeds. They were all talk and no action.

The parable makes the point that in the final analysis, it's only by our deeds that we prove what we are and who we are. It's only by our actions that we establish whether we're genuine Christians or phony Christians. Words alone don't count for anything.

It's our actions and not our words that matter. It was St. Anthony who gave us the expression that our parents used on us: "Actions speak louder than words." Actions do speak a lot louder than words. We can't *say* that we're followers of Christ if we don't *show* by our lives that we're His followers. Our Christian faith must be evidenced by the way we live our lives.

Mahatma Gandhi was once asked what could be done to make Christianity take firm root in India. He answered, "The first thing I would advise the Christians is that they all begin to live their lives as Jesus Christ lived His."

My friends, as we begin to live our lives more and more like Jesus lived His, our lives become more authentic witnesses to our faith. And if there's anything that this world so desperately needs, it's Christians who witness to their faith, not by their words, but by their actions.

It doesn't matter what comes forth from our lips. What matters are the actions that come forth from our hearts. It's been said that Christ is not a psychologist, but a cardiologist. He listens not to words, but to hearts. If Jesus were to put a stethoscope to your heart, what would He discover: words or actions?
