# A Message From Jennifer Noll, Catechetical Coordinator

"The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith."" (Luke 17:5)

Simply put, faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God.

Faith is an easy word to say. It's an easy word to define. But when it comes to living lives of faith, we humans tend to run into great difficulty. To live a life of faith means to surrender your entire life over to God. It means abandoning your own selfish desires and coming to the realization that everything you have, including your very existence, is a gift from God.

In today's gospel, we learn that faith didn't just magically appear in the hearts of the apostles. Yes, even the apostles, those great role models and proclaimers of the Good News, needed the Lord's help in increasing their own faith. How lucky for the apostles to have been able to witness the teaching and example of Christ himself to help them make the radical transformations in their lives that true faith entails!

Faith is one of the theological virtues but, like all virtues, it increases the more it is exercised. Fortunately for OLS, we have the equivalent of a spiritual Planet Fitness for exercising the virtue of faith: a CCD classroom! The nineteen men and women who are part of our catechetical team "flex" their faith muscles each week by being witnesses to the presence of Jesus Christ in their own lives. As such, being a catechist is greater than simply being a teacher of a subject. It is more akin to introducing your students to someone you deeply love.

Like the old exercise adage, "No pain - no gain," faith requires commitment and sacrifice. For twenty-five weeks this year, our catechetical team members will set aside time from their busy lives, to create and present engaging lesson plans which seek to "introduce" the 184 students in the CCD program to Jesus Christ and the great story of our salvation. Faith, like love, requires sacrifice - and there is no shortage of that on Monday and Tuesday afternoons! There are many catechists who teach CCD immediately following a full day of work or school. Others need to coordinate babysitting for younger children. One catechist also provides transportation for a carload of neighborhood kids who wouldn't be able to attend CCD without her help. And one exceptionally devoted catechist even drives up from the Jersey Shore each week!

Thankfully though, these efforts and sacrifices are never in vain. For thousands of years, people have known that the best way to expand one's knowledge about a topic is to teach it to someone else (especially a skeptical and questioning middle schooler). Want to increase YOUR faith? Consider teaching CCD next year and increase not just the faith of the students in your class, but your own as well. If even a little faith in Jesus, the size of a tiny mustard seed, can achieve unimaginable outcomes, imagine what faith the size of a bulging bicep can do!



A Dominican Sister for 63 years, Sister Honora Nolty has dedicated her life to Catholic service. She began her ministry in education, serving as a teacher, principal, and eventually associate superintendent of schools for the Diocese of Brooklyn. She went on to direct the educational arm of Channel, a Catholic peace corps for young college graduates, facilitated the founding of the Inter-community Ministry Volunteer Program, and served as the director of Siena Spirituality Center in New York. For the past 14 years she worked at RENEW as a presenter, director of pastoral services, director of development, and associate director.
