

A Message from Fr. Brian

This Sunday's 2nd reading is quite beautiful. When St. Paul wrote this letter to his young disciple Timothy, Paul was already an old and imprisoned man, soon to be executed by the Romans for his love of the Gospel and his undying insistence on proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord.

In ancient Roman times, people often ended their celebrations with a libation, by pouring out a cup of wine onto the ground as a sacrificial offering to their pagan gods. Paul writes to Timothy that his life is "being poured out like a libation." What he means is that his entire life has been given over as an offering to Christ, who is the true and only God.

Paul knew that the fight was worth it and he kept the faith to the very end, a faith which literally cost him his head. In this same letter, he wrote, "I have fought the good fight; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. And now the crown of righteousness awaits me."

We've all been baptized as Christians and so we've all entered the race. We've gotten into the ring. Are we keeping, and spreading, and living out the faith? Are our lives being poured out like a libation for the sake of Jesus Christ? We can't live our Christian faith as spectators. Instead of going to the concession stand, we have to go to the starting gate or climb into the ring. What does this look like in practice? Well, true Christian "athletes" are those who:


- Fight against sin and temptation, who go to God like the tax collector in this Sunday's Gospel and humbly say, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner."
- Fight against evil and injustice in the world.
- Speak up for and help the poor and the disenfranchised.
- Use their vote to protect the most vulnerable among us.
- Strive to understand and be obedient to the will of God and to the teachings of the Church, even when it's not convenient or easy to do so.
- Make sure that their children and grandchildren are learning their Christian faith. They pray together as a family every day and they make room for Jesus in their homes.
- Aren't ashamed of their faith and stand up for it when it's mocked and ridiculed.
- Support their Church, even when the Church lets them down.
- Seek to develop a deeper love and friendship with God by speaking to Him in daily prayer.
- Allow their faith to influence their daily actions.
- Place all their trust in Jesus. When tough times come along, they dig in deeper and believe even more firmly. When suffering comes along – as it does for all of us – they entrust themselves to God and unite their crosses to the Cross of Christ.
- Take recourse to the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation.
- Find union with Mary and the saints.
- Never, ever give up, they never, ever lose hope in God. They firmly believe that God will never abandon them or forget them.

Friends, we can't just sit back and watch others fight the good fight. We can't just be spectators. We need to run the race ourselves. God has given us all that we need to win: the death and resurrection of Christ, the Scriptures, the Church, the Sacraments, Mary and the saints, and His never-ending love and mercy. Like St. Paul, let's fight the good fight, let's finish the race, let's keep the faith. And let's inherit that crown of righteousness.


Last year Socktober resulted in a tremendous response from the people of the parish. The need is still there. Please help.
