

### A Message from Fr. Brian

In this Sunday's 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, St. Paul encourages us: "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." Good advice! St. Paul urges us not to be anxious, not to worry, but rather to bring all our cares before God. And yet, of all the living creatures that God made, we human beings are the only ones that worry. And we worry about everything. You name it, somebody, somewhere is worrying about it. Of course, we all know deep down that worrying doesn't produce anything but ulcers. It's the darkroom in which negatives are developed. It's like a rocking chair – it gives us something to do but it doesn't get us anywhere.

St. Paul gives us a way to deal with anxiety and worrying: turn to God, open our heart to Him, and allow His peace to guard our hearts and minds. This week, we will have a wonderful opportunity to open ourselves up to the peace which only God can give. On **Tuesday and Wednesday (Oct. 10-11)**, our parish will participate in the annual Archdiocesan Rosary Congress. We will have 24 hours of perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, beginning on Tuesday following Mass at 7:00 pm and concluding with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesday at 7:00 pm. At the top of each hour, we will pray the Holy Rosary.

On Wednesday evening at 7:00 pm, before Benediction, we'll have a reflection by Fr. Stephen Dufrene, C.F.R., a priest of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal and a wonderful homilist and speaker.

We all know that our world, country, Church, and perhaps even our families are in turmoil right now and that we are all anxious and worried about what the future holds for us. There's one thing that we need more than anything to deal with this anxiety: prayer. An especially powerful form of prayer is spending time before Our Lord in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. When we combine that time with Him in the Eucharist with prayers to Our Blessed Mother by means of the Rosary, we are assured of finding peace, a peace which "surpasses all understanding."

All are welcome to sit in our church in prayer and in peaceful reflection for any part of the 24-hours, but if you'd like to commit to one hour of Adoration, it's not too late to sign up, which you can do on our parish website (www.olschurch.com) or here:



Worried? Anxious? In turmoil? Jesus understands what you're going through. Accept His invitation to spend some quiet time in prayer with Him and Our Lady. They guarantee you one thing: it will be your most productive and peaceful time of your week.

### **Update from the OLS Food Pantry**

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2022, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4<sup>th</sup> Street entrance (buzz to be let in) or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning.
