

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

Experts tell us that babies need to be held and touched a lot. They have a basic need for physical warmth and contact. They don't want to be ignored. Babies cry because they instinctively know that's the way to get attention. Crying is their way of calling out, of saying, "Hey, don't ignore me."

We all know that ignoring someone – including babies – is one of the worst things that you can do to a person. It's dehumanizing. So, imagine how happy the lepers in this Sunday's Gospel were when they were cured. Someone cared for them. Someone took the time to focus-in on their needs. They were used to being ignored and shunned. But here, Jesus, as He always does, shows us that He cares for those that the rest of the world seems to ignore.

Jesus heals the 10 lepers. Because leprosy (Hansen's Disease) has largely disappeared today from the Western world, we tend to forget what a terrible and terrifying disease it really is. But the truth is that there are still thousands of cases worldwide, mainly in Africa and Asia. The victims must live with a disease that causes terrible mutilation of the human body, including the loss of fingers and toes, and as the disease progresses, the victims are left blind.

And as if the disease itself isn't cruel enough, it also comes with social ostracism. And that was even more true in Jesus' day than in our own. Lepers then were forced wear a bell around their necks, as if they were cattle. They had to live outside the city walls, and they had to cry, "Unclean, unclean!" when a person without leprosy approached them.

But in our Gospel, Jesus responds to the neglect of the lepers, those who had been ignored by their society for so long. He healed all 10 of them. In the history of the Bible before Jesus, there had only been 2 cases of lepers being healed. This Sunday's 1<sup>st</sup> reading tells us of the healing of Naaman. The other was the healing of Miriam, the older sister of Moses.

There hadn't been a person healed of leprosy in 700 years! Then Jesus heals 10 of them at once. Talk about the extravagance of His healing love! But only 1 returns to thank Him. It sure seems like the other 9 were guilty of ingratitude. And Jesus notices it. He points it out to those around Him.

We all, hopefully, would have shown our gratitude for something so unforgettable, incredible, and amazing. After all, it's natural to thank God when He's done something amazing and incredible for us. You know, everything we have and everything we are is pure gift from God. The only thing that we can claim for ourselves are our sins. Everything else is a gift from God. And hopefully we're thanking God for all of those gifts and blessings.

Thanking God isn't just for Thanksgiving Day. We ought to spend a few minutes each and every day thanking God for His gratuitous, in things both big *and* small, even those things that at first don't necessarily seem like blessings. It's called having an attitude of gratitude.


