Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is my obligation to annually report to you the financial condition of our parish. On the next page of the bulletin, you will see a two year comparison for the fiscal years 2018 and 2019 (our fiscal year ends on June 30th).

As you can see, for these two years our parish operated at a net surplus, which is very good news. While our Sunday, Christmas, and Easter collections are down significantly, we have been able to stay in the black due to the amazing job that our Nursery staff does. The "Other Revenues" item on the financial summary is comprised almost entirely of revenues from the Nursery and in the year ending June 30, 2019, the Nursey had a net income of \$136,914. In addition, we received a one-time bequest of \$110,475 in 2019. Without the income received from the Nursery and that one-time bequest, the parish would have operated at a deficit in 2019.

On the revenue side, almost every other parish that I am aware of has seen a decrease in Sunday collections over the past year. The consensus among all of the pastors that I have spoken to attributes this decrease to the continuing fallout from the (former Cardinal) Theodore McCarrick abuse scandal. It will take years for the Church to regain the trust that it has lost. At Our Lady of Sorrows, we are working very hard to reestablish that trust and to ensure always and everywhere the protection of our young people. This is an ongoing effort, but please know that it is our number one priority.

On the expenditure side, Msgr. Emery did a wonderful job of cutting expenses wherever he could and Fr. Rich and I and our Staff have searched for ways to continue to save the parish from unneeded expenses. As a result, you'll notice that our expenses actually decreased last year from the previous year, even though we had to contend with ever rising health care premiums. We know how hard you work to earn a living and we wish to honor that by taking very seriously the need to be good stewards of your giving.

With our revenues from collections having decreased and knowing that our expenditures will surely inch up as we go forward, we find ourselves dependent on the Nursery, which isn't a healthy financial model to follow. It would be wonderful if the parish could meet its expenditures by means of collections, without having to rely on the income generated from the Nursery. That would allow us to expand the many ministerial services and activities in which our parish is engaged, while at the same time increasing our financial reserves (our "rainy day" fund).

Recognizing how generous you have already been in your offering, I ask you to prayerfully consider an increase in your financial support to Our Lady of Sorrows, if you're situation allows for that. If you are unable to do so at this time, please consider giving more to the parish by means of your time and talent.

Finally, allow me to take this opportunity to thank you for all that you do for our parish. Since arriving at OLS in February, I've been inspired by your commitment to and support of our parish and your involvement in the life of our parish. We are a stewardship parish which encourages each of us to share of our time, treasure, and talent and I'm so grateful that so many have responded to that challenge. And allow me to once again thank you for welcoming me so warmly into this parish family! From day one, I've felt right at home and I'm so deeply grateful for the many kind words and gestures you've shown me. You are truly a blessing in my life!

May you and your families continue to grow in God's love and may His providence continue to bless our wonderful parish.
