

A Message from Fr. Andrew

"No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves."

I don't know about you, but for me, these words of the wise women in today's Gospel sound a bit mean. Or maybe too cold might be a better way to put it. Couldn't they really share, even just a little bit of flasks of oil they had, so all of them could have stayed ready to welcome the bridegroom? By the time those foolish virgins went off to buy the oil to keep their lamp lit, it was too late. The door was already locked. The ones who kept the oils to themselves entered the banquet, and others who did not have any oils are left outside.

However, I want to invite all of us to focus on one detail. The foolish ones brought "NO" oils, while the wise ones did. Jesus doesn't mention how much of a flask of oil that wise virgins brought. In other words, what truly mattered was not so much the quantity numbers of flasks of oils the wise virgins had but the fact that they had oils, while the foolish ones did not have any.

What would this mean? I think what Jesus is talking about is that what is admirable about the wise virgins and what got them into the banquet is their desire to keep the flame going. They did not want to lose the flame, and they wanted to present their fire burning brightly to the bridegroom and run to greet Him. The fire they had on the torch lamp was the love for their Bridegroom, and keeping it was their non-compromised priority. They keep the fire of love for their master while staying awake and, therefore, equip themselves with flasks of oil, which is the faith and hope that one day, their bridegroom will indeed return and embrace them with unfathomable love. That is what granted them the joy of the banquet.

At times, we tend to think that the proper attitude as Christians is to be willing to yield, tolerate, and compromise for the sake of others. Yes. Being considerate of others is a crucial aspect of our lives as people who belong to Christ. However, there is one thing we should never yield for the sake of anything: our love, faith, and hope for our Bridegroom Jesus Christ. Just like Christ would not compromise anything in loving and saving us, we must have the same heart for Him. Even when the darkness we experience while waiting for His return prevails and persists, and perhaps may suggest we give away the oil that will keep our flame, we must be strong to keep it.

Everyone is responsible for equipping themselves to have the flame God gave us in the baptism. When our Bridegroom returns, we won't be able to blame others for having our light extinguished. So, this week, why don't we start thinking about how to keep the fire going? It can be prayers, going to confessions, daily mass, and the act of charities that make us suitable brides of Christ. If we haven't bought the oils yet, we better do that now! The sooner, the better, and we do not have time to let ourselves fall asleep and wake up to buy the oil. It will be too late by then since Christ, our loving and beloved Bridegroom is already on His way to return.


