A Message from Fr. Rich

In this very familiar Gospel account, we are given a very graphic portrayal of a common truth that pervades the teaching of Christ. That is—we will be held accountable and judged on how we use what God has given us in this life. The gifts from God are freely given, we cannot earn them. However what we are able to earn is whether we spend eternity sharing in the master's joy, by being a good and faithful servant, or whether we spend eternity in the darkness outside by being a wicked, lazy servant.

Lest there be any question as to what the darkness outside is..it is the darkness of not being in the light of Christ. It is the darkness devoid of the master's joy. It is the darkness outside of the Master's presence. It is the darkness where there will be wailing and gnashing of teeth. "Gnashing of teeth" is when one grinds one's teeth together, or has one's teeth set on edge, as when one bites down in pain, anger or anguish. The phrase is used 7 times in the New Testament as a description of the fate of the unrighteous at the final judgement. Thus the darkness outside is the state of eternal extreme pain, frustration, anger and anguish. In a word, Hell!

As an aside, the flames of Hell are often depicted by those Saints who have been give a glimpse of Hell as giving off intense heat, but giving off no light!

However, to end on a more positive note, we see in this Gospel, again, that each servant has been given an amount by the master. The Master does not give the same amount to each servant. One is given 5,000 silver pieces by the master, one 2,000 silver pieces and one 1,000 silver pieces. Again, what we have is given to us freely and graciously by the Master, though we all do not get the same amount. All of us have been given to the extent that we are capable of accomplishing. We all have different capabilities, as we are all uniquely and wondrously created by our Master. This shows us the Love that the Master has for each of us.

What shows us the Mercy and Justice of the Master, is that one is only expected to use fully and profitably and give a full profitable return of what one has been given. Each and every one of us is capable of sharing in the joy of the Master, because each and every one of us has been given the ability to accomplish what is expected by using fully and profitably what we have been given. There is no one left out, that is, except the one who does not make use of what one is given.

To the one who received 5,000, he presented 5,000 more. "My Lord, you let me have five thousand. See, I have made 5,000 more." The Master said, "Come share your Master's joy!" To the one who received 2,000, he presented 2,000 more." My Lord, you let me have two thousand. See, I have made 2,000 more" The Master said, "Come share your Master's joy!" Both given different amounts, but both used profitably what was given to the fullest extent. Both are given the same reward. "Come share your Master's joy!"

Finally the man who had received the 1,000 stepped forward. "I went off and buried your thousand silver pieces in the ground. Here is your money back" Well, you know how that story ends.

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.

Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables. Food donations can be dropped off in the front vestibule of the church Monday-Friday 7am-3pm or Saturday, 8:30am-3:00 pm and at the front door of the rectory 3-5pm Monday-Saturday. All donors and staff will have their temperatures taken before being allowed to enter the blood drawing site


