

## A Message from Fr. Brian

Next Sunday, we begin the Holy Season of Advent. But before we begin our preparations for the coming of Christ at Christmas, we first celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. In the 1920s, Communism was spreading all over the globe. Pope Pius XI saw it as a threat because it tried to repress belief in Christ and it tried to suppress the presence of the Church in the world. Communism was – and still is – nothing more than a powerful series of outrageous lies. In the face of these lies, something needed to be done. And so to proclaim the fact of Christ's kingship in the Universe, Pope Pius XI in 1925 proclaimed the Feast of Christ the King.

This feast was established and proclaimed by the Pope to reassert the sovereignty of Christ and the Church over all forms of government and to remind Christians of the fidelity and loyalty they owed to Christ if they want to be future citizens and heirs of the kingdom of heaven.

Of course, our King is no ordinary king. In fact, the last thing that Jesus resembled as He hung on the Cross on Good Friday was a king. He was bathed in blood, not clothed with royal purple. He was hammered to a Cross, not seated on a throne. He was crowned with thorns, not with gold and diadems. No, our King is no ordinary King. Our King's power comes from His passion, death and resurrection. But Christ's kingdom cannot be crucified. Christ's kingdom is forever.

The first purpose of the Feast of Christ the King is to recognize Christ's kingship in the universe and to proclaim it to an ever increasingly secularized world.

But there's another, perhaps even more important, purpose to this Feast: to examine our lives and ask ourselves whether Christ, whom we proclaim as King of the universe, actually reigns in our own lives.

Far more fundamental than the question of whether Christ is recognized by the state is whether Christ's lordship is recognized and lived by us. Is Christ truly King of my life? Is He the Lord of my time? Is He the Lord of my wallet? Is He the Lord of my conversations? Is He the Lord of my time spent on the Internet and on social media? Is He the true source and summit of my hopes and aspirations? Is He *my* King?

Friends, we can't have Christ rule some parts of our lives and not others. The Lord Jesus Christ is Lord of all or not at all. We get to decide.

The Kingdom of Christ is a Kingdom of Faith, Hope and Love. If we sometimes fall victim to a life of doubt, despair and anger, then maybe it's time for a regime change in our heart. Let us surrender our whole life to Christ the King. Let Him be the Lord of our entire life. Of every aspect of our life. The choice is ours. We get to choose who will sit on the throne of our heart.
