

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

This Sunday's readings focus on the afterlife and they give us the opportunity to reflect upon what happens to us after we die. Without intending to be morbid, it's always a good thing to review what the Church teaches about certain things, including the afterlife. And besides, the Church's teaching is the teaching of Christ Himself and it is very good news because it means that eternal life awaits us. So back to Catechism class we go.

All those who die before the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming of Christ will be judged immediately at their deaths. This is known as the *particular judgment*. We call it the particular judgment because it's particular to each person. As Catholics, we believe that when we die, we'll have to account for our lives, for all the good that we've done, as well as for any sins that we've committed.

Now there are 3 possible outcomes to the particular judgment: Heaven, Purgatory or Hell. Those whose love for God has been perfected in this life are taken straight to *Heaven*, where they enjoy endless happiness in the face-to-face vision of God. These are those souls that die in the grace of God. We celebrated them on November 1<sup>st</sup>. The happiness of Heaven is amazing. It consists in seeing God immediately and directly, clearly and distinctly, face to face. We call this the Beatific Vision. It's impossible for us to understand the happiness of Heaven. Every pleasure has some limitation, some imperfection. But in the face-to-face vision of God, there is no imperfection. Once we see Him as He is, we will be filled to capacity with love of Him. And we will be perfectly happy. What a reward! That's Heaven.

Those who die in God's love but still love Him imperfectly must first be purified before entering into Heaven. If we have died without atoning for our venial sins, Our Lord in His love and mercy will first purge and heal our soul in *Purgatory*. After this purgation and healing, our soul will then be welcomed into Heaven. Purgatory is not a temporary Hell and it's not permanent. Purgatory lets us know that we're welcome in Heaven, but that first our souls must be clean. So Purgatory turns out to be the anteroom to Heaven, and it consists of rehabilitation rather than retribution. And it's good news because it means we're on our way to Heaven. By the way, saying prayers and having Masses offered for the dead help them to make that transition from Purgatory to Heaven.

Now for *Hell*. The Bible clearly attests to a place of eternal damnation called Hell. Hell doesn't come from the imagination of man. It's biblically based and Jesus Himself referred to it many, many times. The Church has also consistently taught that Hell does indeed exist. We have to remember that God doesn't predestine anyone to go to Hell or desire for any soul to be lost. God lovingly gives us the grace that we need to do good and turn away from evil. But a person, with the full consent of his will, can still choose to do evil, to commit mortal sin, and thereby to turn away from God. If a person doesn't repent of mortal sin, and doesn't have any remorse and persists in this state, then that person's rejection of God will continue for eternity. In a sense, people put themselves in Hell. We must therefore pray for the grace to resist temptation and follow the way of Our Lord while at the same time always seeking forgiveness – including in the Confessional – for any failing.

So Heaven, Purgatory or Hell: that's what happens after the particular judgment. But as Catholics, we also believe in the Resurrection of the Body. Every Sunday, we profess in our Creed our belief in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection of the dead will occur, we don't know. But we do know that when it does occur death will be no more. Death will no longer have power over us. The dead shall rise and those souls will have their souls united again to their bodies. And we'll all will have a glorious, transformed, spiritualized body.

At the Resurrection of the Body, we'll rise with the *same* bodies, except devoid of any disease or weakness. Just as everything came perfect from the hand of God at the time of Creation, so everything will be restored to perfection after the Resurrection of the Body. Our bodies will be transfigured into a glorified form. No more canes or eyeglasses or aches and pains!

At the Resurrection of the Body, God's purpose will be accomplished; the human race will attain its final destiny; and the reign of Christ over mankind will commence and will never end. There will be Heaven on earth.

So that, in a nutshell, is what happens after we die. It's good news because we ourselves will determine whether or not we enjoy the Beatific Vision. God has given us the unbelievable gift of our freedom to allow us to choose our eternal destiny. And if we choose rightly, something unbelievable, unimaginable, and unspeakable awaits us: union with God and all of his angels and saints forever. In the meantime, if we have sinned, we simply ask God's forgiveness and then move on and continue to live in His love as we await our eternal reward.

We'll let St. Paul have the last word: "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, God has prepared for those who love him."

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables. Food donations can be dropped off:

- Monday-Friday: 9:30-4:00 4th Street entrance (lower Church – buzz to be let in)
- Saturday: 8:00-6:00 Church front vestibule
- Sunday: 8:00-12:00 Church front vestibule
- Please do not leave food at the Rectory.


