

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In last year's letter accompanying the 2020 financial and pastoral report of the parish, I wrote the following: "I think I speak for nearly every person in the world when I say that 2020 is a year none of us ever wants to see repeated...Definitely 2020: just go away and don't come back ever again! And 2021: come quickly and bring better and brighter days to us!"

2021 was better and brighter than 2020 in many ways as we have learned to better cope with the effects of COVID and other challenges. But still, we are struggling, whether as a world, a nation, a faith community, or as individuals, as we attempt to return to the days that we once characterized as "normal."

Even as we continue to mourn the loss of live and the many other losses we have experienced due to COVID, it's also true that the challenges we've faced over the past year and a half have also presented opportunities and have helped us to grow and reprioritize what we consider most important in life. You no doubt have noticed this in your own life. Likewise, the parish of Our Lady of Sorrows has had to find new ways to live out her mission of making God better known, loved and served. With this report, I wish to convey to you how OLS has continued to build up the Kingdom of God by means of the sacramental and ministerial life of the parish over the past year.

Through October 20<sup>th</sup> of this year, we celebrated 45 baptisms, 33 funerals, and 21 weddings. These numbers are all up from last year, when we celebrated 35 baptisms, 29 funerals, and 10 weddings. I expect that in 2022 we will celebrate many more baptisms, funerals, and weddings.

This Fall, we resumed our in-person CCD classes, with an enrollment of 175 children. I give enormous credit to Jen Noll, the Director of our CCD program, and Colleen McDonald, the Administrative Assistant for CCD, as well as our 15 wonderful catechists, for the amazing job they're doing in helping our children to grow in their understanding of the faith. This past Easter Season, 41 children of our parish received their First Holy Communion.

Thank you to Chris Kaiser, our Youth Ministry Director, and Colleen McDonald, who is also Administrate Assistant for that program. On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 28 of our young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation (the same number as the previous year). This year, we have 28 Freshman and 32 Sophomores participating in our Youth Ministry program.

Our RCIA program rejoiced with the 2 adults who went through our RCIA program and completed their Sacraments of Initiation. Thank you to Sr. Mary Selina, S.C.C., and our RCIA team for preparing these adults for the reception of the Sacraments.

Our music ministry, under the direction of Preston Dibble, continues to add so much beauty to our liturgies. Having such a large and vibrant music ministry is so important for a parish (especially during a pandemic!). Preston has also started a new youth choir this year, for students in high school. Be sure to save the date of December 19 for our annual Carol Sing!

Our parish school now has its highest enrollment in decades. 274 students are now enrolled, which is the highest enrollment in many years and is a huge increase from the enrollment of 189 just two years ago and 208 last year. Congratulations to Principal Judy Foley and the entire faculty and staff of Our Lady of Sorrows School. Go Crusaders!

After a brief shutdown at the beginning of the pandemic, our Nursery is once again open and we currently have 36 children enrolled, compared to 42 children when the pandemic hit. The Nursery provides much needed income to the parish and we are very grateful to Nursery Director Karlene Campbell and her very talented staff for the incredible accomplishment of safely reopening and providing childcare to many local families. Our biggest challenge with the Nursery is finding aides/teachers to join

our team. The labor shortage has been a real challenge for the Nursery. If you are interested in a position with the Nursery, please inquire with me or Karlene Campbell.

Our Food Pantry never stopped operating during the pandemic when so many of our neighbors were in need of food assistance. We currently serve 350-450 families through this ministry and that is made possible by your continued financial and food donations to the Food Pantry. We are very grateful to the Food Pantry's leadership team and volunteers, who offer so much of their time and energy in carrying out this essential ministry of our parish.

The social life of our parish has slowly come back over the past year. Our annual parish picnic, after a recess last year due to the pandemic, resumed this September and attendance was the largest it has been in at least 20 years, as more than 250 people came to reconnect with fellow parishioners and neighbors. We look forward to offering many more social events over the next year.

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Rosary Congress on October 6-7 was a wonderful demonstration of the deep faith of our parishioners and your love for our Blessed Mother. Many other spiritual events and programs occurred at OLS over the past 12 months and they show that the faith is alive and well in SOMA!

Now, for the financial picture of the parish. Our financial year ends on June 30<sup>th</sup> and you can see an abbreviated and comparative income statement for the past 2 years on the following page. The parish financial position, I am happy to report, is strong. Our balance sheet is actually in a stronger position than it was pre-pandemic. You, our parishioners, have been incredibly generous to the parish. Not surprisingly, our Sunday collections are down a bit from last year due to the fact that Sunday attendance this past year was less due to the pandemic. Sunday collections for the current year (2021-22) are now running above our budgeted amount as our attendance is slowly building up to pre-pandemic levels.

The GoFundMe page we started at the direction of the Archdiocese of Newark at the beginning of the pandemic (and which has now been discontinued) raised more non-assessed funds than any other parish in the Archdiocese, a total of \$69,830, which is significantly higher than the parish which raised the second highest amount. In addition, our parish pledged \$100,056 to the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. This amount compares to the average of the 4 previous years of \$55,343. Because we beat our goal this year of \$75,607, OLS will receive a rebate from the Archdiocese in the amount of \$24,449 and the rate of assessment that we pay to the Archdiocese on all of our ordinary income will drop from 16% to 14% this year, which will save us approximately \$15,000 this year. Thank you so much for your incredible generosity! The love you show our parish continues to astound me!

As you can see, the parish saw a financial operating surplus this past year, thanks to your generosity that I highlighted above as well as the fact that OLS was the recipient of 2 large bequests from the estates of deceased parishioners. Without these bequests, we would have had an operating deficit. This highlights the importance of remembering OLS when planning your estate. We are always surprised and incredibly grateful when a parishioner remembers OLS in his or her will. Please prayerfully consider doing so. It's a magnificent way of extending your legacy at OLS.

On the expense side, we strove to cut expenses where possible and, as you can see, our total expenses were about \$138,000 less than the previous year. We take very seriously our obligation to be good stewards of your giving, while at the same time ensuring that our 5 parish buildings are well-maintained and managed.

Finally, allow me to once again express my sincere gratitude for your commitment to and support of our parish. I will have completed 3 years at OLS this coming February and I am continually inspired by the love you have for OLS and your active involvement in the life of the parish. As you have done since I arrived at OLS, I invite you to continue to share your thoughts with me about our parish. This is YOUR parish and your spiritual home and we, the clergy and staff of OLS, are here to serve you. Please become as active and invested in the parish's sacramental, ministerial, and social life as possible!

May the year 2022 be filled with many blessings for you and your families. May God's providence continually watch over you and may you forever enjoy the maternal protection of Our Blessed Mother.
