

A Message from Fr. Brian

This past Friday the world had to endure another Black Friday, the day when crazed shoppers hunt for the latest, greatest merchandise. Why do we call it "Black Friday?" Well, in 1966 an article appeared in *The American Philatelist*, a stamp collectors' magazine. Apparently the Philadelphia police department had used the name to describe the traffic jams, crowding, and mayhem in the downtown stores. Since then, the Friday after Thanksgiving has taken on a life of its own and most people seem to think it's the beginning of the Christmas season. Wrong. This Sunday, we don't begin celebrating Christmas. Instead, we enter into the holy season of Advent. Rather than surrendering to the temptation of going directly into Christmas, why don't we take the time to celebrate *this* season that so many have forgotten about – the Season of Advent? Let's remember the reason for *this* season.

The readings, especially the Gospel, alert us to the fact that something great is about to begin. The language is emphatic. And dramatic. Christ warns us to be watchful, to be alert. He is coming and Advent's purpose is to prepare ourselves for the arrival of the King, to be filled with hope, and to not be caught sleeping when He does come.

At Our Lady of Sorrows, I'd like to draw your attention to some events and activities that will help us enter more fully into this season of preparation and which will ready our hearts and minds for the Birth of Our Savior.

- *Monday, December 2, 7:00 pm, Upper Church:* Advent Reflection Talk. Dr. Mary Marron-Corwin, a well-known neonatologist, will get us ready for the miracle of Christmas by relating her own stories of the miracle births of her 3 children. Dr. Marron-Corwin is a VERY engaging speaker and you will be deeply inspired by her talk. Don't miss this!
- Wednesday, December 11, 7:00 pm, St. Joseph Church in Maplewood: Advent <u>Penance Service</u>. What better way for us to prepare ourselves for the arrival of the Christ Child than to make our souls as pure as possible? Together with the parishioners of St. Joseph's, we will have a communal penance service, followed by individual confessions. Receive the mercy and forgiveness of the Prince of Peace!
- Sunday, December 15, 4:00 pm, Upper Church: <u>Annual Carol Sing</u>. Join our 3 choirs (72 members in total!), which have been working very hard to prepare new and fresh arrangements of traditional Christmas hymns. There will be selections for all of us to sing together, as well as sacred choral pieces that will help us to reflect on the many wonderful texts of Our Savior's birth. Following the Carol Sing, our Youth Group will present an outdoor living Nativity production. Hot chocolate and cookies will be served. This event is well-known throughout South Orange and indeed the Archdiocese of Newark.

Please see the bulletin for additional details about these events and other activities that our parish is planning to help each of us enter more fully into the mystery and miracle of Our Lord making His entry into our world and into lives.

In this new liturgical year, this new beginning, let's be filled with hope and let's be ready for Christ's coming, both as a babe on Christmas morn and in His majesty at the end of time. And let us sing out to Him: O Come, O Come Emmanuel!

THINK ABOUT IT

"Jesus himself lived in violent times. Yet he taught that the true battlefield, where violence and peace meet, is the human heart: for 'it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come' (*Mk* 7:21). But Christ's message in this regard offers a radically positive approach. He unfailingly preached God's unconditional love, which welcomes and forgives. He taught his disciples to love their enemies (cf. Mt 5:44) and to turn the other cheek (cf. Mt 5:39). When he stopped her accusers from stoning the woman caught in adultery (cf. Jn 8:1-11), and when, on the night before he died, he told Peter to put away his sword (cf. Mt 26:52), Jesus marked out the path of nonviolence. He walked that path to the very end, to the cross, whereby he became our peace and put an end to hostility (cf. Eph 2:14-16). Whoever accepts the Good News of Jesus is able to acknowledge the violence within and be healed by God's mercy, becoming in turn an instrument of reconciliation. In the words of Saint Francis of Assisi: 'As you announce peace with your mouth, make sure that you have greater peace in your hearts."—Pope Francis, World Day of Peace Message, 1/1/17 Think About It . . .


