

December 11, 2022 3rd Sunday of Advent

Message from Fr. Brian

We call this Third Sunday of Advent "Gaudete Sunday," *gaudete* being the Latin word for "rejoice." The word "rejoice" comes from the Opening Antiphon of Mass: *"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! Indeed, the Lord is near*" (Phil 4:4-5). On "Gaudete Sunday," we light the rose candle on the Advent Wreath and the priest wears a rose-colored vestment, because rose is the traditional color for signifying joy. And so it is worthwhile for us to reflect a bit on whether our lives are filled with joy.

From my perspective, a large number of us don't seem to live their faith with much joy. On the outside, we may seem happy and good-humored, but our inner life is another story. I know that there are tremendous problems in the world: Covid continues, death, war, famine, senseless shootings, all sorts of suffering and sorrow. But at the same time, we have every reason to rejoice because God has come into this world, and He has set in motion the events that will bring an end to all these things. God will speak the final Word, and He has spoken it. The final Word is Christ, who we will soon welcome as a little baby on Christmas morning.

The source of our joy should be Christ, for He plants it in our hearts. And it comes from the conviction that God loves us. We must live our lives fully convinced of God's love, to bask in it, to accept it, to express gratitude for it, and to return it in love to God and our neighbor.

Too often, though, we allow ourselves to be robbed of joy. What are some of the thieves that steal away our joy? One of them is self-pity. We begin to feel bad for ourselves, to begin counting not our blessings, but instead our misfortunes. We start to feel as though we're taken for granted and unappreciated. We say, O poor me! Of course, the problem is that the "me" becomes the focus. The antidote is simple: stop pitying ourselves and think first of the needs of others, rather than our own.

Another thief of joy is worrying. Of all the living creatures, we humans are the only ones that worry. But deep down, we know that worrying produces nothing but ulcers. The old expression says it all: *Worry never robs tomorrow of its sorrow, it only saps today of its joy*. Throughout Scripture, Jesus constantly admonishes us not to worry, but instead to place our trust in Him. His words are not idle. They are His promise. And when we entrust ourselves more fully to God, we experience inner joy.

A third thief of joy is constant complaining. Some people would have even complained about the menu at the Last Supper! Their glasses are always half-empty, they're more prone to criticize than compliment, and they discourage rather than encourage. The opposite of complaining is gratitude. The fact is that we are more blessed and gifted than 99% of the people who have ever walked the face of the earth. Let's work on developing an attitude of gratitude. It will chase away the temptation to complain.

To transform the world, God chose a humble maiden from a village in Galilee, Mary of Nazareth, and the Angel greeted her: *"Rejoice, full of grace, the Lord is with you."* The secret to an authentic Christmas lies in these words. God repeats them to the Church, and to each one of us: Rejoice, the Lord is with you!
