A Message from Fr. Brian

When 34 members of our parish visited the Holy Land in November 2022, one of our stops was in the beautiful and peaceful town of Ein Karem, located about 5 miles from Jerusalem. That town is the site of the 2nd Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, in which we contemplate the visit of Mary, who through the power of the Holy Spirit had just conceived Jesus, to her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist.

After Elizabeth greeted Mary and praised her for having been chosen by God to become the Mother of the Messiah, Mary responded with her beautiful hymn of praise, which we call the Magnificat. The word "Magnificat" is the first word in that hymn of praise, which begins (in Latin), *Magnificat anima mea Dominum*. The literal English translation is "My souls magnifies the Lord."

The words of the Magnificat are translated into more than 50 languages and placed opposite the wall that faces the Church of the Visitation in Ein Karem. This image from Ein Karem depicts Mary and Elizabeth greeting each other, as well as some of the translations of the Magnificat.

In this Sunday's Mass, our Responsorial Psalm includes most of the Magnificat prayer. The translation that we hear this Sunday is, *"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord."* What Mary is doing is redirecting the



praise that Elizabeth had given to her. Mary instead wants all the glory to go to God. Even though the pregnant Mary is overjoyed by the news that she was carrying within herself the Savior of the world, she wants all the praise and glory to go to God. What a contrast to so many of us who want others to glorify or praise us. Mary knows that God is the source of any glory accruing to her.

What a lesson for us! Whatever natural gifts, talents, or abilities that we have, whatever material wealth we may have accumulated, whatever greatness there may be in us, it all finds its origin in God. And, acknowledging that, we should strive to give glory to God for it all.

The Magnificat prayer of Mary is a reminder that to God belongs all the glory. May our lives, like Mary's, proclaim the greatness of the Lord. And like Mary, may we rejoice in the Lord our Savior, for the Almighty has done great things for us, including leaving the glory and greatness of Heaven to take on our human condition and dwell among us.

Stewardship Reflections

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." – 1 THESSALONIANS 5:16 - 18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.
