December 20, 2020 4thSunday of Advent

A Message from Fr. Brian

The Gospel for this 4th Sunday of Advent (Luke 1:26-38) is one of my favorites and it describes the incredible visit of the archangel Gabriel to Mary, announcing to her that she would become the mother of the Messiah. The cover of this Sunday's bulletin shows the depiction of that encounter by the artist Fra Angelico (ca. 1395-1455). That painting is in the monastery of San Marco in Florence, Italy.

There is so much for us to ponder in this beautiful Gospel passage: God's plan of using one of His very own creatures to help accomplish His plan of salvation; God's love in giving us so great a Mother; Mary's obedience to the will of God; Mary's courage in the face of a terrifying prospect; and Mary's complete humility and courage.

But allow me to offer one other reflection, one that centers on the very last words of this Gospel. It concludes by saying, *"Then the angel departed from her (Mary)."* After the archangel Gabriel had stunned Mary with this news, after she had a moment to contemplate it, after she had given her "Yes" to God's plan, after all of this, Mary found herself – alone. The angel was no longer there, and presumably neither were her parents, relatives or friends. Mary was left alone.

There are two ways to contemplate Mary's solitude in this moment. The first is to make sure that we get very, very close to her during these last days of Advent, as she gets ready for the birth of Jesus. Let's make sure to accompany Mary, keeping company with her, contemplating her greatness, and praying to her. Let's make sure that Mary is not left alone this week. Use these days to deepen your love for and your devotion to our Blessed Mother.

Secondly, we might use this Gospel passage as an opportunity to reflect on those around us who are lonely or feel isolated, especially during this time of the year, and especially this year when the pandemic has caused so many people to be left alone, often for long periods at a time.

For the vast majority of us, this is a joyous time of the year, filled with many blessings, including being surrounded by family and friends. But for others – and especially this year – it's a very difficult, painful, and fragile time of the year.

Perhaps you know a widow or widower whose heart still aches over the loss of a spouse and who is feeling especially lonely and vulnerable now. Maybe you know a single person who has no family in the area, or a coworker who has no one with whom to celebrate this season. Try to find someone this week who might be lonely, who might be experiencing isolation. Find those people and love them. Perhaps, if your comfort levels permits it, that means visiting them at their home or inviting them into your own home, or at the very least calling them on the phone.

Nobody should be made to feel alone at this time of the year. Reach out and touch the life of someone who might be going through what Mary was going through 2,000 years ago. What a wonderful way to honor Mary and to bring some Christmas joy to someone who otherwise would not fully experience the joy of Christmas.

On behalf of the priests, deacon, religious sisters, and staff at Our Lady of Sorrows, I wish upon you and your families all the joy and peace of this holy season. May you forever experience the love and blessings of the Christ Child and the maternal protection of His Blessed Mother. A very joyous and Merry Christmas to all!

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.
