A Message From Fr. Brian

The Nativity story captures us year after year, as it brings good tidings of great joy into our lives. And we wonder once more at this amazing event planted in our midst – the birth of Jesus, an event buried deep in history and tradition; and at the same time an event born anew into our hearts with each passing year.

This is the mystery of what we Christians have called for 2,000 years the Incarnation: The Infinite God being born into our frail humanity. And we are reminded that Jesus is born into a place where the first witnesses to who He is and who He is to become are not the experts or the high and mighty. They are the lowly shepherds. And He is born to the most humble of parents, Mary and Joseph.

Can you imagine how excited Mary was? Not just the normal excitement of a mother with her first child – as beautiful as that is – but the excitement of a mother who has had a glimpse of the future and knows that her child is the Prince of Peace. That night must have been something else. In fact, that year in the life of Mary and Joseph must have been incredible. Both of them visited by angels; the events that led them to Bethlehem; the disappointment of finding the inn full; the birth in a barn; the angel choirs singing in exaltation; and then that magical moment when Mary finally held her newborn child in her arms.

Can you picture it all? Don't you wish that you could have held that baby, to look into His eyes, the King of Kings, to grasp His dear little fingers? Don't you wish you could whisper to Him, "Sweet Jesus, I love you?" Don't you wish you had been there? Well, you can still go there. We can all go there by faith and by imagination. Even if we can't get our limited minds wrapped around such a big concept as the Infinite and Omnipotent God becoming man, we can picture a baby. That's something we can all grasp.

And God realized that. Perhaps that is why Jesus came as an infant, born to a man and a woman, in a specific time and place. Joseph and Mary didn't find Jesus in a basket on their doorstep one morning. He didn't just appear out of the wilderness with no past, no family and no connection to you and me. Jesus had earthly parents, relatives and a history. He didn't just *appear* to be one of us; He truly *was* one of us.

God came as one of us. He came to dwell among us, as a defenseless and vulnerable baby, wrapped in swaddling clothes. Not for God's joy, but for our benefit. He came to give us the gift of salvation and new life and to bring His love into the world.

That's the whole meaning of Christmas. Through the birth of this child, God tells us *whose* we are and He tells us that we're loved. This little baby gives meaning to our lives. That's the miracle of Christmas: God staggers the world by stepping out of Heaven and into a manger. That should melt our hearts and fill up our emptiness with joy.

As you celebrate the Birth of Our Savior, I encourage you to live every day of the year as though it were Christmas, as you hold the Baby Jesus in your hearts and share Him with the world that surrounds you.

On behalf of the priests, deacons, religious sisters, and staff of Our Lady of Sorrows parish, I wish upon you all the joy and peace of this holy season. May you and your families forever experience the love and blessings of the Christ Child and the maternal protection of His Blessed Mother! A very Joyous and Merry Christmas to all!

Reflections on Catechism

437 To the shepherds, the angel announced the birth of Jesus as the Messiah promised to Israel: "To you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." From the beginning he was "the one whom the Father consecrated and sent into the world," conceived as "holy" in Mary's virginal womb. God called Joseph to "take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit," so that Jesus, "who is called Christ," should be born of Joseph's spouse into the messianic lineage of David.
