# A Message from Fr. Andrew

# Merry Christmas!

On behalf of priests and staff serving at our Lady of Sorrows parish community, I wish you all a blessed Christmas! It is one of the most special days of the year for us because the true Light has again entered our lives after the wait in the Dawn of Advent. May this time of great joy continue to shed light in all your hearts.

The Christmas carol Silent Night shares with us the image of what the night Christ was born could have been: "Silent night, Holy night, all is calm, all is bright." It is truly a beautiful meditation, but I don't know if I can agree with the lyrics.

When Joseph had Mary on his donkey, knowing the child's birth was imminent, he must have been desperate to find a room for Mary's delivery. Although Mary had no labor due to her sinlessness, imagine the concern of a husband who loves his wife so much and who wants to protect her when there is no upper room available for the delivery (Jewish houses had an upper room for people and a lower room for cattle).

He must have wanted to prevent his beloved wife from having to give birth outside on the street. After knocking on door after door, when he finally found a small lower-level room where animals were usually stored, he must have thanked God for at least being able to provide a room for Mary's delivery. It must have been a chaotic, hectic night. From trying to find the room all night, the self-blame Joseph could have had for not being able to provide his wife a warm and comfortable space for the delivery, and to the reality of having to see Mary give birth, possibly next to animals.

The night was probably very far from "silent and calm," as the hectic reality of human life was all cramped into that small lower room on that night. However, in that night's chaos, God entered the story of humanity. Amidst the uncertainty and the messiness of our lives, He is willing to make Himself fully present in the humblest way: on a manger.

So many things happened in 2023. I wish I could confidently say many more positive things happened this year than not, but unfortunately, we have witnessed much darkness. Natural disasters, divisions, conflicts/wars between nations, the sufferings of innocent people ... the list could go on. However, the light has shone upon us despite the darkness and chaos. The Sun, and the true source of Light, has risen in the small town of Bethlehem and each of our hearts. The mystery of Christmas is that God has become one of us and made Himself Emmanuel – which means God with us!

God is so near us even when He may seem far from us. Sometimes, we try to find God somewhere far away when He is right near us. Just like the people of Israel were expecting the glorious almighty King when, in fact, their King came to them as a tiny infant. God is born again on a small manger of our hearts. No matter how messy our day-to-day is, He becomes the source of our joy today as our savior, who comes to us to make us join in His glory. Let us rejoice and smile, for the long-awaited King is now here to clothe us with His royalty.

So, Merry Christmas! May my voice and yours filled with joy reach heaven singing,

"Angels we have heard on high, sweetly singing o'er the plains, and the mountains in reply echoing their joyous strains. Gloria in excelsis Deo! Gloria in excelsis Deo"!


#### Merry Christmas from the Saints!
