## A Message From Fr. Rich

As I am sitting here on Gaudete Sunday, Dec. 15th, I am somewhat in violation of my admonishment from my homily today to slow down and live in the present. I am tasked with writing this bulletin letter for the Solemnity of the Holy Family, which is two weeks away on Sunday, Dec. 29th.

This is a perfect example of how things go in an imperfect world. It seems there are always "exceptions to the rule." (Although I believe this concept has been inverted and stretched to its limits today, where the adage appears to be "the exception IS the rule") That, my brothers and sisters, is an extremely dangerous condition. However, that will be a topic for another day.

If we look at today's Gospel, it is the epitome of the life of St. Joseph. There is not ONE recorded word of St. Joseph in the whole of Sacred Scripture, which by the way, comprises 750,000 words. That is quite amazing and I believe makes a profound theological point.

St Joseph, by human standards, would appear to be an extraneous appendage certainly to the life of Jesus and helpful but not necessary for the life of Mary. He does not contribute to the human generation of Jesus Christ, which in the flesh is entirely of Mary's flesh.

But he is an integral figure in the make-up of the Holy Family. He is an essential and an integral person within this family, in that **God the Father places him IN the Family of Jesus and Mary.**

His words are not recorded, but his responsibility and his obedience to God the Father are. God commands him, "Get up, take the Child and his Mother and flee to Egypt!" And Joseph immediately complies.

Then after some long length of time in Egypt, God commands St. Joseph, "Get up take the Child and His Mother and set out for the land of Israel!" We are told again that immediately complied with that command.

And not to be outdone, on their way back to Israel, St. Joseph receives another command because of new danger, and went to the region of Galilee and settled in a town called Nazareth.

Quite a series of events for the young family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. These recordings about Joseph who never is quoted as even uttering a sound is an extremely profound Divine viewpoint on the Sacredness of Family. That the glory of Christmas, the glory of our Savior entering into human history, the glory of our salvation occurs within the context of a human family is a Divine affirmation of the essential sacredness of the human family. In a way, the glory of Christmas can be said to be brought to fruition within the family. This occurrence is a Divine affirmation of the necessity of the family.

And think about this: St. Joseph, who is the least within that family unit, (Jesus is Almighty God, Mary is the Immaculate Conception, never experiencing the stain of sin), is given the monumental task of guiding that family through history! And even more amazingly, God Almighty and Mary the sinless Mother of God never countermand his guidance. They cooperate fully with his charge.

That's why this family is Holy. Holy means to be designated or consecrated for God's use. In this Holy Family there is never a clash of Egos. There is never one-upmanship. There are no jealous feelings. There are no power plays. There are no squabbles about authority. All the family members are dedicated to following the will of God.

Now, maybe, that may be why St. Joseph never had a recorded word in Scripture. The Word they all lived for and obeyed was God's. No need for anyone to say anything in that case, except "Yes." And remember, actions speak louder than words.

All families are called to be Holy. All families are called to be the sacred means to ensure the continuation of the Christmas glory throughout human history.

*"Wives, be subordinate to your husbands...Husbands, love your wives...Children, Obey your parents in everything...Fathers, do not provoke your children..." Colossians 3:18-21*

### Reflections on Catechism

2223 Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. They bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule. The home is well suited for education in the virtues. This requires an apprenticeship in self-denial, sound judgement, and self-mastery – the pre conditions of all the "material and instinctual dimensions to interior and spiritual ones." Parents have a grave responsibility to give good example to their children. By knowing how to acknowledge their own failings to their children, parents will be better able to guide and correct them.

### **Thank You from the OLS Food Pantry!**

Thanks to the generosity of the OLS Parish and the SOMa community, your Food Pantry was able to serve 225 patrons for Thanksgiving and 185 patrons for Christmas. From gift cards to fresh produce, coffee, jam, holiday foods, and grocery staples, we were thrilled to be able to provide such a wide assortment of items. The Pantry will now take a little break and formally re-open in early January. That said, we can always provide food on an emergency basis if you are or know someone in need.

As part of our mission, we are committed to improving the nutritional quality of the foods we offer. During 2019, we provided more fresh produce, milk, and low-salt/low-sugar non-perishables than ever before. Our partnerships with MEND, local CSAs, and the Elks-Rent Party garden across the street provide much free produce. Your monetary donations allow us to purchase bananas and produce out of season. We worry that recent cuts in the SNAP program (formerly food stamps) will mean more patrons to serve in 2020, but we will continue to seek grants and kind donors like you. 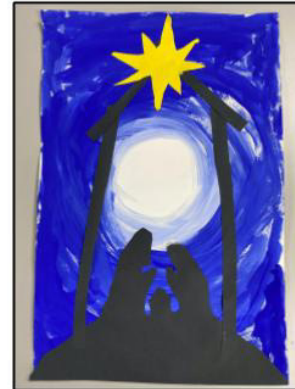

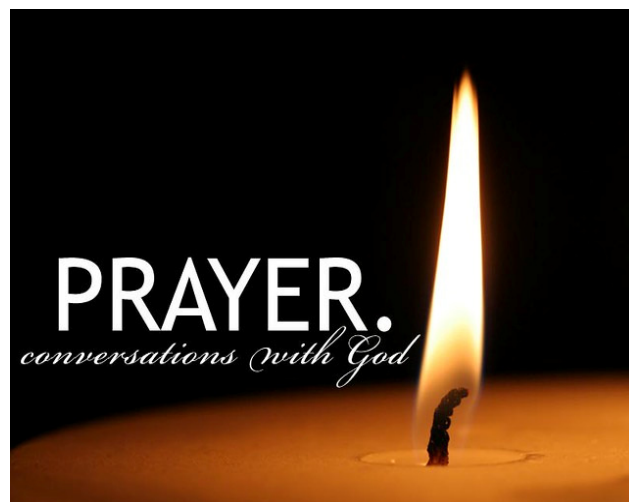
