A Message from Fr. Andrew

I was a student at Seton Hall University for eight years as a seminarian until May of this year before joyfully returning to Our Lady of Sorrows as a parochial vicar. I used to go to the campus gym to exercise and release the stress from classes. One of the interesting things about that facility is that it gets way too crowded in January. There had been times when I went there in the evening, and there were way too many people that I would finish a set of workouts on one machine for five minutes and spend the next ten minutes trying to find a machine or free weights available for use!

I wondered, "Why are so many new people coming to the gym in January despite the cold weather"? Something I couldn't understand was that most of those newcomer students disappeared after a few weeks, and the gym started getting less crowded in mid-February. Soon, I found out the reason. It was a New Year's resolution. Many students start the year with the slogan "New Year, New Me". However, unfortunately, that desire to make a change and to become a better version of self slowly fades away as the daily grinds of classes, internships, and all other commitments start building up. It starts becoming challenging to commit to the resolution of becoming a better self once things start to get hectic.

I think this can happen to all of us. We can come up with plans for things to do to let ourselves grow in many aspects of our lives before the new year begins, and we see ourselves running out of gas to do what we've planned to do amidst the busyness. Today, the first Sunday of Advent, is the beginning of the New Year for all Catholics. It is the best time for us to reflect upon the past year and start planning what we want to do to grow in the love of God for the year that awaits us. If patience is a virtue we want to grow in, now is the time to resolve, and if helping people experiencing poverty is something we want to do more, now is the time to think about what we can do.

However, most importantly, we must ask for God's grace in prayers since the flame of the Holy Spirit given to us by God cannot be preserved without the source of that flame: God Himself! Without prayer life, we won't be able to persevere and fully commit ourselves to grow in holiness – the love towards our God and neighbors.

We may not know what to do as we welcome the new liturgical year. Thankfully, the Church teaches us what we are called to do as we begin the new year with advent. It is preparing ourselves to welcome our King, who, out of love, becomes a tiny infant. Well-preparedness to welcome Christ will make us want to love like He did, which is the willingness to make ourselves small and share the burdens of the ones we truly love. Isn't that what the mystery of Incarnation is, God making Himself small as an infant to bring us to His greatness? May we, under the help of God's grace, persevere in our new year's resolution. Let's make our Church more crowded as we begin the new year, like the gym at Seton Hall University in January, but let's keep it that way until the end of time!
